James D'Amour, 2771 Maplewood, spoke in opposition to the proposed project, the Weber Rezoning, at 2857 Packard Road. He urged Council to vote no at First Reading.

2. Abdullah Al-Mahmudi - Street Parking on Traverwood Drive (DS-2)

Abdullah Al-Mahmudi, speaking on behalf of the Muslim community of Ann Arbor, asked Council to consider allowing the on-street parking as part of the Traverwood road reconfiguration. Parking on Traverwood would allow his community to access the mosque for worship, especially on Fridays, he said.

3. Kristine Abouzahr - Parking on Traverwood Drive (DS-2)

Kristine Abouzahr, a member of the Islamic Center, spoke about the community's parking issues. She urged Council to allow parking on Traverwood.

4. Abdummah Amin - Parking on Traverwood Drive (DS-2)

Abdummah Amin, a member of the Muslim community in Ann Arbor, spoke about the need for parking on Traverwood to assist the Islamic Center with their Friday prayer service. He urged Council to allow the plan for parking on Traverwood to proceed.

5. Erica Briggs - Road Reconfiguration Pilot for Green Road (DS-3)

Erica Briggs, on behalf of the Washtenaw Bicycling and Walking Coalition, spoke in favor of the Traverwood project, including the need for parking, and also spoke in support of the Green Road reconfiguration pilot project. Ms. Briggs also spoke in support of the work of the City's staff.
