Tamara Real, 411 Fountain, spoke about the ordinance to amend the Clty's Percent for Art program. Ms. Real spoke in opposition of the proposed change from one percent to one-half percent. She encouraged Council to consider the importance of the arts when considering the budget situation.

2. Jeff DoBoer - Huron River Impoundment Management Plan (DC-1)

Jeff DeBoer, President of the Pioneer Rowing Club, spoke about the proposed Huron River Impoundment Management Plan. Mr. DeBoer spoke in opposition of the proposal to shift the maintenance costs to recreational users, such as the rowing community.

Thomas Partridge - Stabilization funds to enact affordable housing, public transportation, public service healthcare. Give ultimate gift to most vulnerable residents. (DS-4)

Thomas Partridge, Washtenaw County Democrat, spoke about advocating change at all levels. He urged Council to give funding priorities to human needs.

4. David Barrett - Huron River Impoundment Management Plan (DC-1)

David Barrett, 1810 Alhambra Drive, stated he is a member of the Parks Advisory Commission. Mr. Barrett spoke about the proposed Huron River Impoundment Management Plan. He expressed concerns about the work of the committee that proposed the recommendations in the resolution.

5. Elizabeth Riggs - Huron River Impoundment Management Plan (DC-1)

Elizabeth Riggs, 2344 Yorkshire, spoke about the proposed Huron River Impoundment Management Plan. Ms. Riggs spoke in support of the plan and stated the plan is well supported by the City and the community. She also expressed concern that maintenance costs are currently being funded by the City's drinking water fund despite the fact that the dam does not provide drinking water to City residents.

6. Michael Taft - Huron River Impoundment Management Plan (DC-1)

Michael Taft, 818 W. Jefferson, stated he was a member of the HRIMP committee as a representative of the rowing community. Mr. Taft stated he enjoyed his participation on the committee; however, he felt that the outcome of the committee was pre-determined. He advised Council to consider the recommendations carefully.

7. Kermit Schlansker - Decisions

Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, spoke in opposition of the removal of the Argo Dam. He urged Council to utilize the dam for new and innovative projects for energy and local food supplies.

8. Justin Heslinga - Argo Dam

Justin Heslinga, 426 Kellogg St., spoke in support of the removal of Argo Dam. He stated the removal of the dam would improve the park and support the free-flow of the river, making Ann Arbor an environmentally progressive city.

9. Tony lannone - Argo Dam

Tony lannone, 3201 Featherstone Court, expressed concern about the Huron River Watershed Council advocating for political action regarding Argo Dam. He asked Council to reconsider supporting this organization.

10. John Rubin - Argo Dam

John Rubin, 1424 Henry, spoke in support of the removal of Argo Dam. He stated it is environmentally sound to remove dams and noted that Argo Dam has no purpose except to create Argo Pond.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER RAPUNDALO

Councilmember Rapundalo thanked City Administrator Roger Fraser and his staff for putting together the Council Retreat. He stated he thought this was a really good retreat for Council, despite the difficult issues that were discussed. He asked the Mayor to discuss the highlights of the 2011 fiscal year.

MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje informed the members of the public that the Council met at the Clty's Wheeler Center last Saturday to discuss the City's current budget situation. He stated Ann Arbor's budget is not as dire as other Michigan cities, but still needs to be addressed. Mayor Hieftje stated he proposed a Council pay cut of 3 percent. He would like city staff and the city unions to also take this pay cut. This cut would save the City approximately \$1.5 million in costs. Mayor Hieftje also noted that over the last five years, the City has reduced its staffing from 1000 employees to 766. Mayor Hieftje also discussed the fund "buckets" in the City, such as the water fund and parks millages. Money collected in those funds can not be used to support the General Fund operation. Mayor Hieftje noted that the City is also losing the Pfizer tax revenues this year due to the sale of that land to the University of Michigan. Mayor Hieftje stated that Michigan schools and other cities are facing this budget crisis as well, and the State budget is projected to be even worse next year.

City Administrator Roger Fraser responded to questions that were raised regarding proposed firefighter layoffs, including how the truck staffing issues will affect response times to fire rescue situations.

Mayor Hieftje addressed a concern regarding the construction of the Police and Court Building. He stated the maintenance costs of the new building were anticipated as part of the construction plans.

COUNCILMEMBER RAPUNDALO

Councilmember Rapundalo stated the City is looking at all possibilities for budget reduction, including outsourcing services. He stated the City would like to maintain service levels where possible.

COUNCILMEMBER DEREZINSKI

Councilmember Derezinski spoke about the possibility of collaboration with other local governments, including the Clty of Ypsilanti.

COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith stated the Police Department crime report is now available by calling 734-794-6933 for those who are unable to receive the report via email. Councilmember Smith also noted that she does not have her parking meter resolution ready for this meeting, but it will be ready for December 21.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere stated she will be recognizing members of the public who support the City non-monetarily, such as through the Adopt-A-Park program. She stated she will be bringing a resolution to the January 4 meeting recognizing a group for their Adopt-A-Park efforts.

COUNCILMEMBER TEALL

Councilmember Teall stated the Senior Center Task Force is meeting on December 16 at 4:00 pm at the Senior Center to review options for the future of the Center.

COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin urged Council to consider more transparency in government decisions. He suggested a Ways and Means committee to review the budget as a whole regularly, similar to the County's committee of this nature.

COUNCILMEMBER HOHNKE

Councilmember Hohnke stated the Mack Pool Taskforce is meeting on December 10 at 6:30 pm at Ann Arbor Open School to update the public on the group's work and to solicit additional input on the future of the pool.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Roger Fraser thanked councilmembers for their time on Saturday at the retreat. He updated the public on the state of the budget and the additional cuts that are necessary since the budget approval last May. He noted that the City has received additional State-shared revenue cuts, in addition to declining property tax revenues.

Mr. Fraser stated that there will not be a Work Session on December 14.
