Spotlight: Financial Reality Fairs

Financial Reality Fairs are experiential learning events that allow students to simulate living on their own for a month, from a financial perspective. Students are provided with an identity, a job, starting salary and credit score. The students then visit a variety of stations to select goods and services needed to live on their own, such as housing, transportation, and food. The final step in the process is to visit with a financial counselor to review their choices and improve their financial situation. Our strong commitment to assisting teachers with hands-on activities continued as we proudly hosted 15 Financial Reality Fairs in 2019, a 50% increase over last year.

Reality Fairs were conducted at high schools in Macomb, Oakland and Wayne counties. MSGCU also worked in partnership with the Michigan Council for Economic Education and Money Smart Week to coordinate an event.



Business Development and Community Sponsorships

MSGCU is proud to support community initiatives through paid sponsorships and/or in-kind donations. In 2019, we provided needed support in the community while taking advantage of opportunities to highlight the benefits of being an MSGCU member.

8th Annual High School Marketing Competition

In December, six high school teams from three different schools participated in this annual competition. Each team of four students pitched their campaign ideas to judges in the MSGCU boardroom, focusing on acquiring teen checking and debit card accounts. Each team displayed their research, analysis, and formal presentation skills. The teams also enhanced their collaborative and project management skills while gaining valuable real world experience from a financial marketing perspective.

Oakland Schools Technical Center Campus-Northwest won the competition, edging out Troy Athens and Oakland Schools Technical Campus-Northeast teams.



Community Plan

In 2019, the Community Plan was established to further enhance our community presence through an increased financial investment that benefits communities and members throughout our footprint. Several opportunities were evaluated during the year. MSGCU made the commitment to support Scarlet's Smile, a Commerce Township-based, non-profit. The \$10,000 donation supported the mission to build a barrier-free, all-inclusive playground where all kids, regardless of their ability, can play together. Coinciding with the opening of our 15th branch office in Commerce Township, this provided value in supporting a worthy cause and developing relationships in our newest community.

Federal Home Repair Grant Program

MSGCU provided approximately \$217,000 to area homeowners in 2019 through 37 grants as part of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Indianapolis (FHLBI) Neighborhood Impact Program. The grant program helps homeowners with maintenance they otherwise couldn't have afforded such as new siding, windows, and roofs. MSGCU is a member/owner of the Federal Home Loan Bank of Indianapolis (FHLBI) where their mission promotes homeownership by annually granting funds to lower-income households.



LEAD Team

Spotlight: Maggie's Wigs for Kids (www.wigs4kids.org)

MSGCU made a \$1,000 donation to Maggie's Wigs for Kids by conducting a spring flower sale. Each hanging basket sold contributed \$7 towards the charity. Maggie's Wigs for Kids provides hair replacement systems and support to children who have lost their hair due to chemotherapy, radiation or other conditions at no cost to the family. The organization provides wigs and education on the care and maintenance, as well as classes and social groups where kids can recover from the emotional, social and psychological side effects of hair loss.



Classroom Cash Grants

MSGCU was proud to award 71 Classroom Cash Grants totaling \$51,375 to educators seeking funding for innovative classroom projects.

- 116 local educators from 87 schools across Metro Detroit submitted applications to fund classroom projects.
- More than 110,000 votes were received from teachers, students, parents, colleagues, friends and family during the ten-day online voting period.

Scholarships

As a Credit Union founded by educators, we believe that individuals should be afforded the opportunity to better themselves through continued education. MSGCU provided \$106,500 in scholarship dollars for the following scholarship programs in 2019:

Rudolph Heino High School Scholarship - \$12,500 awarded

Awarded to five high school seniors who embody the MSGCU philosophy of "people helping people."

Larry Swantek Educational Studies Scholarship - \$10,000 awarded

Awarded to four high school seniors who plan to major in Education or to current college students with an Education major.

Educational Solutions Scholarship - \$45,000 awarded

Awarded to eighteen high school seniors who plan to attend a two- or four-year college or university.

Educator Advantage Scholarship - \$10,000 awarded

Awarded to four certified educators and administrators (of early childhood, primary, secondary and post-secondary schools) attending a continuing education program, college, or university.

Stephen Thomas First Responders Scholarship - \$24,000 awarded

Awarded to graduates of the fire and police academies at Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, and Schoolcraft College.

William Cayen Skilled Trades Scholarship - \$5,000 awarded

Awarded to students pursuing a certificate in a skilled trades program at Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, Schoolcraft College, or a Skilled Trades School (Dorsey or Northwestern Technological Institute).





Awards & Accolades

96% Member Satisfaction. MSGCU is proud to consistently receive high rankings in our annual member satisfaction survey each year.

Detroit Free Press Top Workplace Award. MSGCU was named a Top Workplace by the *Detroit Free Press* for the seventh consecutive year. Results are based on feedback from MSGCU team members via a survey conducted by Energage. Companies are measured on qualities, including company leadership, career opportunities, workplace flexibility, compensation and benefits.

MCUL Desjardins Youth Financial Education Award recognizes outstanding personal financial education programs for young people. MSGCU earned first place for our innovative youth programs including Financial Reality Fairs, High School Marketing Competition, and classroom workshops aimed to reach students where they are most comfortable and eager to learn.

MCUL Desjardins Adult Financial Education Award recognizes outstanding personal financial education programs for adults. MSGCU was awarded first place for our home buyers workshops. In 2019, we held 18 workshops and helped 600 soon-to-be homebuyers.

MCUL Louise Herring Philosophy-in-Action Member Service Award recognizes model credit union efforts to materially improve members' lives. MSGCU was awarded second place for our quick response to assist government employees who were furloughed as part of the federal government shutdown in December 2018. We offered our Furlough Loan, which featured no application fee, no payments for 45 days, and a fixed, low rate. As part of the program, we also allowed a no-fee Skip A Pay on existing consumer loans.

Anchor Bay High School/CTE Department Outstanding Employer Award

Shannon McIntosh, MSGCU Consumer Education Specialist, was named Outstanding Business Partner by Anchor Bay High School and was recognized at the Macomb Career Technical Education Administrators Association Annual Awards Celebration. Shannon accepted the award for her work in teaching financial literacy to more than 200 high school students.
