I am writing to hopefully get all of you to really consider the safety and well being of all of us Ann Arbor residents. Yes I am a resident and yes I am a city employee. No I am not a firefighter. I chose to be anonymous due to concern of backlash from my department head. Recently, there was a structure fire that resulted in the death of three residents, and I read that the response time was an issue according to Mr. Fraser. So I believe that Mr. Fraser knows the importance of a quick respone time and I hope you do to. But I still cannot get over the fact that you would consider cutting our fire department again. If you cut the proposed 14 firefighters, you do understand that you will have to close one or possible two fire stations. I know that there is 5 districts (wards) that you represent. There is also 5 fire stations that almost outline the same coverage as the wards. I wonder how it will be decided as to what fire station(s) will be closed. Maybe the one closest to your home? I know that the economy is bad and we have to have balanced budgets, but we are not as bad off as alot of the cities here in Michigan. There has to be a priority put on public safety. Just how much will you understaff our public safety departments? Time is very crucial in any emergency whether it be a fire or a life threatening emergency. I just hope that I will be protected and that the fire station closest to my home does not get closed. What about you? Will you tell your spouse or loved one, your children, and your neighbors that you chose to close yet another fire station which could ultimately result in their death. Even the cut in the number of firefighters alone will have a devastating affect on how they operate. Mr. Fraser knows this, he has told them that they would have to change the way they do things. You know what this means? They go to a defensive attack on the fire (this means no one goes in).
