


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Winter Maintenance Goal

- Provide passable roadway
 - Free from drifts, snow ridges, and as much ice and snow pack as is practical and can be traveled safely at **reasonable speeds**.
 - May not be bare pavement

Funding Sources

- All street winter maintenance is funded by State of Michigan Act 51 revenue. This revenue is received from flat rate tax on motor vehicle fuels and vehicle registration fees.
- Sidewalk and path winter maintenance is funded through the general fund.



Winter Weather Conditions

- Light Snow Less than four inch accumulation
- Heavy Snow More than four inch accumulation or forecast conditions that exceed the regular street maintenance resources
- Snow Emergency Conditions that exceed all City resources

Light Snow Response

- Salt Major roads first if necessary switch to plowing
- The City's Public Services Area clears the high volume streets, bridges, (trouble spots)
- De-icing materials are also applied to salt route streets as they are plowed

Heavy Snow Response

- 24/7 operation Utilize all resources
- Residential plowing started based on Solid Waste schedule
- Snow Desk staffed, webpage updated
- Encourage removal of vehicles from street
- Schools and private streets/lots are responsible for their own maintenance

Snow Emergency Response

- Declared by City Administrator or designee.
- Parking restrictions may be placed citywide or in designated areas
- Utilize all available resources.
- Use of contractors for additional services.

Anti-Icing / De-Icing / Traction Enhancement


- Salt is used to prevent bonding of snow and ice and to keep accumulation workable
- Salt is used only on designated salt routes
- Sand is used to improve traction on local streets

Prioritization Salt Routes

- 1 Primary Salt/Plow Routes
 - Highest volume road travel lanes
- 2 Secondary Salt/Plow Routes
 - Next lower volume roads, turn lanes, median lanes.
- 3 Curb and Shoulder plowing


Primary Salt/Plow Routes


- The first priority is to clear the primary major streets
- The high-volume major are broken into three routes




Secondary Salt Routes


- Once the primary salt routes are cleared, the secondary salt routes are then cleared.
- There are 8 secondary salt routes.











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Follow on Activities

- Turn lanes, passing lanes, deceleration lanes and median lanes are cleared and treated after the travel lanes have been completed
- Local trouble spots

Curb and Shoulder Plowing

• Bike lanes, shoulders and gutter pans are plowed back to allow for future storm events after primary and secondary salt routes have been cleared and treated

Local Sand/Plow Routes


- Once the primary and secondary major streets have been cleared and de-iced in an area, the local streets can then be cleared and treated
- The local streets are comprised of 22 routes


Local Treatment Doctrine


- Utilize all Field Operations resources on overtime if accumulation is four inches or greater. 12 hour shift operations until substantial completion is obtained
- Under four inch accumulation utilize straight time only for plowing and sanding
- Flexible based on forecast and conditions
- Sand application for traction enhancement at trouble spots. Full length sanding of streets not provided.


Prioritization Local Routes


- 1 Local Street Plow Routes (residential)
 - Next Solid Waste section that containers haven't been placed out.
 - Through streets
 - Cul-De-Sacs, Dead ends and Alleys
- 2 Sidewalks and Paths
 - City Facilities
 - Median Islands
 - Pedestrian Refuge
 - Other median island walkways
- 3 Haul Away locations

















AATA bus routes and shelters

- The majority of AATA routes are currently on City designated salt routes
- Clearing of snow and ice accumulation at designated bus stops and shelters is provided by AATA

Non Motorized Routes

- There are 11 non-motorized routes
- Routes are staffed only after street maintenance vehicles are fully mobilized
- Equipment utilized is unsuitable for road and street use
- Site conditions may require haul away at a later time (bridge shoulders)

Sidewalks fronting City property

- Our goal is to clear and treat all city owned walks within the timeframes specified by ordinance for the adjacent properties if not earlier
 - Non residential All snow and ice which has accumulated on the adjacent public sidewalk prior to 6am must be removed by noon.
 - Residential Within 24 hours after the end of each accumulation of snow greater than 1 inch, the owner of every residentially zoned property must remove the accumulation from the adjacent public sidewalk and ramps leading to a crosswalk
