### **Comprehensive Transportation Plan Additional Tasks**

On February 18, 2020 City Council referred the following item to the Transportation Commission:

Resolution to Appropriate \$21,700.00 from General Fund to Fund Additional Tasks Associated with the Comprehensive Transportation Plan Update Project and to Approve an Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement with Sam Schwartz Consulting, LLC (\$373,370.00)

#### **Healthy Streets**

On May 4, 2020 Ann Arbor City Council passed <u>R-20-158 Resolution to Promote Safe</u> <u>Social Distancing Outdoors in Ann Arbor</u>, including direction to consider lane or street re-configurations on residential streets through a public input process.
