## Sustainability & Innovations Corner

**A<sup>2</sup>Zero** — Our carbon neutrality work is continuing to move swiftly, so to stay up to date, check out our website: <a href="www.a2zero.org">www.a2zero.org</a>. Individuals interested in helping support implementation should send a note to <a href="sustainability@a2gov.org">sustainability@a2gov.org</a>. Other current efforts of the Office of Sustainability and Innovations (OSI) include:

- Greenhouse gas inventory The 2019 community-wide greenhouse gas inventory has been completed and submitted to the Carbon Disclosure Project. Last year, Ann Arbor was one of 105 cities globally to receive an A score (<a href="https://www.cdp.net/en/cities/cities-scores">https://www.cdp.net/en/cities/cities-scores</a>), leading the transition to a climate-safe future. Compared to 2000 emission levels, greenhouse gas emissions have reduced by about 20%, but we have a lot of work to reach our 2030 goal to eliminate the 2.1 million metric tons of carbon-dioxide equivalent greenhouse gases associated with the community's activities. That's around 43 metric tons per household. - **Solar on your home** Interested in getting solar on your home? If yes, check out our new A2Solarize program which helps reduce the upfront cost of solar by 5%–15% through a coordinated bulk buy. The program is available to all Washtenaw County residents. - **Electric bicycles** Ann Arbor's e-bike discount program is going strong! More vendors are coming onboard, which means more deals on bikes and accessories. Check a2gov.org/evs for updates, and email Simi Barr (<a href="mailto:sbarr@a2gov.org">sbarr@a2gov.org</a>) with any questions.
- Ann Arbor's Northside Community Center now has a 23.53kW solar system along with two lithium-ion batteries, laying the foundation for the site, which will offset all of the site's energy usage, becoming the city's first resilience center. This project was part of the city's unanimously adopted A2ZERO Carbon Neutrality plan, which outlines a path for how the entire Ann Arbor community can achieve a just transition to community-wide carbon neutrality by the year 2030. The Northside Community Center battery system was funded through a Sustaining Ann Arbor Together Grant provided by the City of Ann Arbor, while the solar power system is paid for by a Solar Moonshot Program grant, funded by Left Coast Fund and managed by Hammond Climate Solutions.

**Public Hearings.** There are (3) public hearings which are listed below and under second readings.

- A Public Hearing and Resolution to Approve Home2 Hotel Site Plan and Development Agreement, 361 West Eisenhower Parkway (CPC Recommendation: Approval - 8 Yeas and 0 Nays). Approval of this resolution will allow for the construction of a new hotel and associated parking, landscaping and stormwater improvements.
- A Public Hearing and Resolution to Approve the Valhalla Annexation, 9.8 Acres, 31, 50, 57, 77, 97, 98, 107, 145, 147, 151, 155, 159, 163 Valhalla Drive (CPC Recommendation: Approval 8 Yeas and 1 Nay). Approval of this resolution will allow annexation of these properties from Pittsfield Township into the city. The property is within the City's water and sewer service area, and the current use is consistent with the adjacent zoning, land uses and mater plan. Council action on the proposed R4E (Multiple-Family District) zoning and associated Valhalla Ann Arbor site plan will be scheduled after the annexation process is complete.)

#### **Ordinances – Second Readings.**

• A Public Hearing and An Ordinance to Amend Title VII (Businesses and Trades) of the Code of the City of Ann Arbor by Adding a New Chapter Which Shall be Designated as Chapter 97 (Short-Term Rentals) (Ordinance No. ORD-20-24) (postponed from August 8, 2020). Upon direction of the City Council Resolution R-19-112, City staff initiated the work to prepare a report on the feasibility of regulating short-term rentals in the City. Council considered the feasibility report, and directed the City Administrator to pursue regulation of short-term rentals as specified in the report in Resolution R-19-593 and from this direction staff prepared this ordinance.

#### **Ordinances – First Readings**

- An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 55 (Zoning), Zoning of .74 Acres from TWP (Township District) to R1C (Single-Family Dwelling District), 1780 Scio Church Road (CPC Recommendation: Approval 8 Yeas and 0 Nays). Approval of this resolution will zone this .74 acre parcel form TWP to R1C. This site was recently annexed into the City, effective on July 30, 2020 as notified by the Secretary of State to the City Clerk.
- An Ordinance to Amend Sections 5.24, 5.29.2, 5.33.2, 5.35.2, 5.36.2 and 5.37 of Chapter 55
   (Unified Development Code) Of Title V of The Code of The City Of Ann Arbor Sign

**Regulations.** This ordinance is the result of a long period of evaluation and amendments by City Planning, City Attorney's Office, as well as feedback and direction from the Historic District Commission, Downtown Development Authority, and of course, the Planning Commission.
