Moved by Borgsdorf, seconded by Kraut, to approve the Resolution to recommend entering into an agreement between the City of Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County, by the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission regarding responsibilities and cost allocation for design and engineering services for the Bandemer-Barton trail connection project

On a roll call vote, the vote was as follows with the Chair declaring the motion approved.

**Resolution reads as follows:** 

RESOLUTION TO RECOMMEND SIGNING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR AND WASHTENAW COUNTY, BY THE WASHTENAW COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION REGARDING RESPONSIBILITIES AND COST ALLOCATION FOR DESIGN AND ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE BANDEMER-BARTON TRAIL CONNECTION PROJECT

Whereas, in 2005, the City of Ann Arbor commissioned and received a feasibility study for the Bandemer-Barton Pedestrian Tunnel; Whereas, this non-motorized connection has been desired for more than two decades, but due to insufficient funding and the difficulty of obtaining approvals from the railroad, progress on the tunnel has been delayed;

Whereas, since the 2005 study, the railroad has changed from private ownership to being publicly owned by MDOT; Whereas, the County, Huron Waterloo Pathway Initiative, and City previously signed a Letter of Intent dated May 2, 2018 to collaborate on an update to the Bandemer-Barton Pedestrian Tunnel 2005 Feasibility Study, which update was completed in 2020 (Bandemer-Barton Trail & Underpass Study dated November 13, 2020 prepared by Bergmann and OHM Advisors) and set forth preferred design options for use in the Design Phase for the project; Whereas, the LOI also contemplated County and City would enter into further agreements as necessary to advance the project; Whereas, County and City expressed interest in working cooperatively to complete the Design Phase of the Bandemer-Barton Trail Connection Project and share thecosts thereof;

Whereas, County has solicited, received and evaluated proposals for the Design Phase, and having shared and discussed the proposals with the City, the parties agree County should award a contract to Bergmann, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant," to perform the services and work needed to complete the Design Phase;

Whereas, County will enter into a contract with Consultant and administer the completion of the Design Phase work in accordance with this Agreement and its exhibits and attachments;

Whereas, County and City will each be responsible for funding and paying for a portion of the Design Phase as established in Exhibit B (County 55% / City 45%);

Whereas, the City of Ann Arbor portion of funding needed for this design phase is estimated to be \$199,702.08 and funds are available in the approved FY2020 Parks Maintenance and Capital Improvements Millage budget; and

Whereas, County and City have reached an understanding regarding the performance of and payment for the Design Phase and desire to enter into this Agreement to memorialize that understanding;

RESOLVED, that the Parks Advisory Commission recommend City Council enter an agreement between the City of Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County, by the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission regarding responsibilities and cost allocation for design and engineering services for the Bandemer-Barton trail connection and tunnel project.
