Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:11 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom Jr., Municipal Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 100 N. Fifth Avenue.

- 1. Thomas Partridge Affordable housing and support services public transit, health care and education (DS-9)

Thomas Partridge, 4220 Eyrie Dr., addressed Council regarding Washtenaw County's promise to address significant issues facing the City, County and the region regarding affordable housing, support services to public transit, health care and education.

2. Joan Doughty - Bryant Neighborhood flooding problem

Joan Doughty, 2401 Meadowridge Ct., representing Community Action Network and the Bryant neighborhood residents, addressed Council regarding flooding problems in the area. She requested that the City Council appoint a Bryant Community Flood Remediation Taskforce that would include city and county governmental representatives and flood and water management experts to identify a comprehensive remediation plan and funding to represent and implement the recommended resolution.

3. Alan Haber - Library Lot Commons

Alan Haber, 531 Third St., said that the Library Lot Committee has reviewed all proposals regarding the Library Lot and have nothing to recommend. He stated the committee is four months or more delinquent in submitting its report. He asked that Council call upon the committee to deliver its report on the RFPs, conclude its function, and allow the matter to return to the City Council agenda and public consideration.

4. Kathy Griswold - King School Crosswalk

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Foxhunt Dr., addressed Council regarding the process of the Transportation Safety Committee. She said that the committee approved the removal of the crosswalk at King School and the project was stopped. She asked that Council direct the City Administrator to move the crosswalk and take action for student safety.

5. Joseph Miriani - Arizona immigration Law

Joseph Miriani, 2401 Pittsfield Blvd., expressed concern with Council's recent resolution regarding Arizona's Immigration Law.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER HIGGINS

Councilmember Higgins said that the Design Guidelines Committee has been meeting every week, are still on schedule and may be early in bringing the design guidelines back to Council.

COUNCILMEMBER DEREZINSKI

Councilmember Derezinski said that the Washtenaw area corridor is one of the most traveled corridors in the city and other communities abutting each other. The Washtenaw Corridor Study has been studying this issue and they met last Thursday. Merchants along Washtenaw Avenue were responsive to what was being done.

COUNCILMEMBER TAYLOR

Councilmember Taylor said that there is a proposal to de-light a certain number of street lights throughout the city. The de-lighting is because some of the areas of the city exceed the Illuminating Engineering Society of North America's recommended practice for roadway lighting standards. It was proposed and voted by staff that we investigate whether or not we could save money by de-lighting some of the street lights. The Brockman area is currently a pilot program area for de-lighting. The response has been that the residents did not care for the de-lighting. They are still in the process of gathering data; the pilot program is still on-going.

COUNCILMEMBER RAPUNDALO

Councilmember Rapundalo replied to a public speaker's comments regarding the Library Lot RFP process. He stated the committee has been trying to find a suitable consultant to assist the city and the DDA with the remaining proposals and the process regarding the Library Lot. It was reported a month ago that a sudden possible change in status on the consultant's part may have given pause to review whether or not to continue discussions with that consultant. Those concerns have been eliminated and there have been additional discussions with the proposed consultant. The agreement between the DDA and the consultant is expected to be complete this week at which time regular meetings regarding the project would be established.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman shared a letter he received by a neighbor in Forestbrook regarding the Sidewalk Repair Program. The letter explained that their neighborhood sidewalks were inspected two years ago. The resident complained about the inconsistencies with enforcement of the program after some residents complied with the city's request to replace slabs and others did not. He asked that staff provide up-to-date information regarding the Sidewalk Repair Program and possibly publish the information in the Ann Arbor Observer.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

STATUS OF THE SIDEWALK REPAIR PROGRAM

City Administrator Roger Fraser said that they would have feedback on the status of the Sidewalk Repair Program by the end of the week.

PARK ADVISORY COMMISSION (PAC) MEETING

Mr. Fraser said that the PAC is scheduled to meet on July 20, 2010 to discuss the Argo Dam Consent Agreement presentation between the City and MDNRE, including what they have to do in terms of vegetation management on the face of the dam. The RFP will be prepared by staff for the repair of the toe-drain. The Fuller Road Project Team will also provide PAC an update on the Fuller Road Project.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Mr. Fraser updated Council regarding the construction on the Police/Court building and City Hall. The DDA streetscape contractor completed their work planting materials in the front of the Police/Court Building. Work still continues with mechanical, electrical, plumbing, drywall, ceiling, ceiling grade, painting and bathroom tile inside the new building. The HVAC system in the new building is now operable. This is necessary to condition the air for painting and other interior work that is temperature or moisture sensitive. Final prep for the floor in the main lobby began this week and the new fire pump for that building has been successfully tested.

There are a number of major changes in the basement of the Larcom Building. Mechanical and plumbing work is progressing well and the interior masonry walls in the basement are complete. Metal and drywall have begun and masonry work in the elevator tower has started.
