#### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:27 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

# 1. Thomas Partridge - Recall Governor Snyder. Protect Ann Arbor and Michigan's disabled residents. Build affordable housing not drug facilities. (I-4, I-7)

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding a recall of Governor Snyder and protecting Ann Arbor and Michigan's disabled residents, as well as the need to build affordable housing units, instead of drug facilities.

# 2. Dennis Hayes - Medical Marijuana Fee (DS-7)

Dennis Hayes, 120 N. Fourth Ave., spoke in support of the proposed medical marijuana fee. He thanked Council and staff for quickly responding to questions regarding medical marijuana and the application process.

# 3. Daniel Marano - West Park Storm Drain Failure Re: Neighborhood Flooding

Daniel Marano, 501 Mapleridge, addressed Council regarding a flooding problem resulting from the recent re-engineering of the West Park storm drain. He said two recent flooding events have destroyed property in his neighborhood. Claims filed with the City have not been addressed, Mr. Marano stated, and something needs to be done.

## 4. Nancy Shiffler - Fuller Road Station

Nancy Shiffler, 2877 Sorrento Ave., addressed Council regarding the Fuller Road Station. She said that she objects to using park property or any portion of park property for parking or a parking structure. She urged Council to be more transparent with Fuller Road Station and to hold public hearings before acting on this project.

## 5. Ali Ramlawi - DDA

Ali Ramlawi, 428 S. Seventh St., owner of Jerusalem Garden, expressed concern with comments made by Susan Pollay to AnnArbor.com regarding the underground parking lot construction near his business. He said that snow removal, trash collection and lighting are ordinary functions that the City of Ann Arbor provides normally, not as compensation for the construction and loss of business. He stated there is a problem with the construction signage in the area and he asked that Council look into this issue and make improvements in the process moving forward. He also asked that Council relook at the DDA, its Board, and the decisions it is making regarding the downtown.

# 6. Kathy Griswold - Sidewalks

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Foxhunt Dr., updated Council on her request to relocate the King School crosswalk. She expressed frustration that this wasn't being done due to costs, when so much money was being spent on crossing guards.

#### **COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL**

#### COUNCILMEMBER TEALL

Councilmember Teall addressed the Council regarding the draft Idling Ordinance that was removed from the New Business section of the agenda and added as a Communication item. She said that Council directed the City Administrator to create

an Idling Ordinance back in 2004. The Environmental Commission has recently reviewed a draft ordinance and this communication tonight is a copy of the Environmental Commission's resolution recommending that City Council proceed with consideration of that draft ordinance.

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere said that a Council Working Session regarding the proposed Fuller Road Station would be beneficial to some councilmembers and the public. Mayor Hieftje replied that when new information is available regarding the project, a Work Session could be scheduled.

#### COUNCILMEMBER DEREZINSKI

Councilmember Derezinski recognized Gary Willie, a local realtor, who was killed last weekend by an alleged drunk driver. Approximately 300-400 people gathered at the Vietnam Memorial building in Ypsilanti Township to pay respects to him.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin expressed concern about the use of parkland in Ann Arbor for other purposes besides parks and recreation. Councilmember Anglin stated that he has received many inquires and concerns from residents who believe that the City Charter protects parkland. He expressed his own concerns with using the Fuller Road property to build another parking structure.

#### COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith said that the "River Up" celebration will take place on August 16, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. at Island Park. A bus tour has also been scheduled to highlight the City's greenway area.
