## CALL TO ORDER

## INT INTRODUCTIONS

# INT-1 Update from Ellen Schulmeister, Director of the Washtenaw County Shelter

Ellen Schulmeister, Director of the Washtenaw County Shelter Association, thanked Council on behalf of the Association and the Delonis Center for their current and past support. The Shelter Association has lost approximately \$400,000.00 in funding while costs continue to go up, she stated. Ms. Schulmeister said the Association has had to cut funding to two vital programs, the warming center and the rotating church shelter program, due to budgetary restraints. The Washtenaw Housing Alliance has asked the Shelter Association to try to raise the funds to keep the warming shelter open for one more year and they are urging Council's support of additional funding.

Mayor Hieftje read a proclamation honoring NAP October Volunteer of the Month -Meg Crawley. 1. Thomas Partridge - End discrimination and corruption by government and business. Recall Republicans and Republican acting Democrats. Require all housing developments to provide affordable housing. (DC-2, DB-2, I-6)

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor Resident, addressed Council regarding ending discrimination and corruption by government and business, recalling Republicans and Republican-acting Democrats and requiring all housing developments to provide affordable housing.

## 2. Karen Sidney - Streets and Sidewalks (DC-1)

Karen Sidney, 100 Longman Lane, said that the resolution of intent regarding the street millage and sidewalk millage funds leaves many unanswered questions. Ms. Sidney posed a number of questions to Council regarding the use of the additional millage funds for sidewalk repair.

## 3. Lily Au - Human Service Fund (DC-7)

Lily Au, 682 Peninsula Ct., addressed Council regarding Human Service funding. She said that the funds allocated for human services do not directly go to the poor. Instead, the money goes to outside agencies like the United Way. She urged Council to make changes to allow more direct funding of services.

## 4. Kermit Schlansker - energy Farm Research and Development

*Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, encouraged Council to consider alternative energy options to improve efficiencies.* 

#### 5. Alan Haber - Library Green

Alan Haber, 531 Liberty Street, addressed Council regarding a proposed Library Lot Green. He said that the land above the underground parking structure could be used as a public gathering place. The Library Green could be built without the use of City funds; could be designed, built, maintained and programmed with volunteer resources.

## **COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL**

#### COUNCILMEMBER TAYLOR

Councilmember Taylor announced that he attended a neighborhood meeting where members of the public expressed concerns about an increase in crime and the need for increased public safety in Ann Arbor. He asked that Deputy Chief Bazick respond to some of those neighbor concerns.

Deputy Chief Bazick replied that statistically, based on tallied reported part 1 and part

2 crimes, crime is currently down in the City. A new program was launched recently called Crimemapping.com which allows for more real-time access to crime reported on a daily basis. Deputy Chief Bazick explained that much of a feeling of rising crime is perception and there really is nothing to indicate that there is an up-swing or a crime wave in Ann Arbor at this time.

## COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Steve Powers reported on the following:

#### GREEN STREETS POLICY

This past Thursday, over 20 residents attended a focus group meeting to explore options for a Green Streets Policy for the City. The Green Street Focus Group, which is a subcommittee of the Water Committee and Environmental Commission, hosted Dave Elkin, a former employee of the Portland Bureau of Environmental Services in the Sustainable Stormwater Division, who discussed Portland's experiences in developing a Green Streets Ordinance. The presentation also included project examples and implemented practices. Dave's presentation will be available online for the public to view at www.a2gov.org/green. The Water Committee's next meeting (November 10) will be a culmination of what the committee has learned from staff and Mr. Elkin, then moving forward into a process of suggestions for policy-making. This process will ultimately guide the City into a holistic approach to stormwater management within the public right-of-way.

## PUBLIC MEETINGS REGARDING STREET AND SIDEWALK MILLAGE PROPOSALS

The public is invited to meet with city staff to discuss the upcoming Street and Sidewalk Millage proposals appearing on the November 8th election ballot. Proposal 1 is the Street and Bridge resurfacing and Reconstruction Millage, which has been approved by voters since 1984. Proposal 2 is a new imitative for a "Sidewalk Repair Millage." The third of three public meetings will be held tomorrow, October 18th, from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. at the Forsythe Media Center, 1655 Newport Road. Details on these ballot proposals are posted at www.a2gov.org/StreetMillage and at www.a2gov.org/SidewalkMillage.

#### STREET RESURFACING PROJECTS

The street resurfacing project for Oxford Street from University to Hill Street is complete.

Currently under construction is Division Street from Huron to Beakes and is scheduled to be completed this week. Longman Lane from Fairview Dr. to Jackson Place is scheduled to be completed the week of October 31, 2011. Lockridge Dr. from King George Blvd. to Eisenhower Blvd. is scheduled to be completed the week of November 14, 2011.

## **COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL**

#### COUNCILMEMBER BREIRE

Those titles are place markers in an agenda; they are not intended to fully describe a decision process or an item being considered.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin requested that the following letter be entered into the record:

#### Hello all,

At the City Council Meeting for Oct 17, 2011 the Council will be asked to permit a height increase for the City Apartments building. It is my understanding that the increase in height is needed in order to have the foundation of the building further from the known water table level. The concern addressed should alleviate the possibility of flooding the foundation and thereby necessitating pumping water from the foundation during flooding conditions.

I support this effort and as part of this effort I would request that all environmental studies that are in the area of this development at First and Washington be made available to Planning Dept for comment. These studies include but not limited to the following.

CDM GIS Storm water pipe study

DDA 1st and William study FTCH was paid for this study. The report of this study is needed and has not been made available.

In short, all the water related studies available to City pertaining to this site is appropriate as data to be used for analysis. Although not apparent at this time, there is a possibility that the Gelman plume may migrate towards this area and may cause pollution during flooding conditions...the City would be held responsible for treating contaminated water before releasing it into Allen Creek. If there is any data that is available to aid us in this planning it is needed now.
