INT-1 Green Community Challenge Award

Luke Forest, representing the Michigan Municipal League, presented the City with the Green Community Challenge Award. The award recognizes communities Statewide

for their environmental sustainability, economic development efforts and their cost efficient initiatives with taxpayer funds. Gold, silver and bronze awards were given out this year and Ann Arbor received the top score Statewide and was placed in an exclusive group of communities receiving the Gold Award. The award was presented to Mayor Hieftje, who accepted it on the City's behalf.

1. Eleanor Linn - Noise Control Ordinance (C-2)

Eleanor Linn, 1321 Forest Ct., spoke in support of the proposed Noise Control Ordinance. She said that she has learned from personal experience that there are some glitches in the City's current ordinance. She said that the current ordinance does not state that holidays are to be treated as Sundays and she has endured construction noise on holidays over the last year.

2. Ian Robinson - Living Wage Ordinance (C-1)

Ian Robinson, 3435 Brentwood Ct., expressed concern with the proposed changes to the Living Wage Ordinance, in particular the portion of the ordinance that would raise the threshold at which the ordinance would apply from \$10,000.00 to \$25,000.00. He also objected to the provision that would exclude non-profits from compliance with the living wage, as many students and other young professionals would be negatively impacted working for non-profits.

3. Debra Polich - Public Art Ordinances (C-6, C-7)

Debra Polich, 2585 Hollywood Dr., addressed Council regarding the two proposed Public Art Ordinance amendments. She asked that If either of the ordinances are approved tonight on First Reading that the public hearing and Second Reading be scheduled out at least 120 days. 120-day notice would give Council, staff and the public plenty of time to have an open discussion and opportunity for input on this community issue.

4. Margaret Parker - Percent for Art (C-6, C-7)

Margaret Parker, 2972 Parkridge Dr., said that Ann Arbor has been designated and established as an arts and culture destination by the Convention and Visitor's Bureau and the award winning Pure Michigan campaign. She said that these designations are one more success that comes from City Council's support for Art in Public Places. She urged Council to continue to support the arts in Ann Arbor.

5. Peter Houk - Alternatives for Constructing a Sidewalk Along Scio Church Road (DS-3)

Peter Houk, 2025 Yeoman Ct., said that he circulated a petition asking the City to install sidewalks on Scio Church Road. He urged Council to approve DS-2 authorizing the study of sidewalks in this area.

6. Lily Au - Human Rights Commission Meeting Minutes (I-1)

Lily Au, 682 Penisula Ct., addressed Council regarding homelessness in Ann Arbor and the need for a daytime warming center.

7. Marsha Chamberlin - Public Art (C-6, C-7)

Marsha Chamberlain, 315 Second St. #401, Chair of the Ann Arbor Public Art Commission, addressed Council regarding the Public Art Ordinance and asked Council to not rush forward with the proposed changes to the ordinance. She urged Council to carefully study the issue.

8. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel

Blaine Coleman, 1501 Ardmoor Ave., called upon Council to pass a resolution to boycott Israel.

9. Mozhgan Savabieasfahani - Boycott Israel

Mozhgan Savabieasfahani, Ann Arbor resident, also addressed Council regarding boycotting Israel and called upon Council to pass a resolution supporting a boycott.

10. Henry Herskovitz - The Myth of Israel's Law of Return

Henry Herskovitz, 404 Mark Hannah Pl., addressed Council regarding the Myth of Israel's Law of Return.
