1. Tom Partridge - Forward the Dream of MLK - Request President Obama to fund affordable housing, transportation, education, and health care. Recall Governor Snyder and Mayor Hieftje.

Tom Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding forwarding the dream of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He urged President Obama to fund affordable housing, transportation, education, and health care. He also said that Governor Snyder and Mayor Hieftje should be recalled.

2. Kathy Griswold - Newport Sidewalk (D-2, DS-2)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Foxhunt Dr., spoke in support of the proposed Newport Road Sidewalk Resolution. She asked that Council review and revise the existing pedestrian crossing ordinance and take a comprehensive look at sidewalk gaps within the City. Ms. Griswold expressed her support for the Police Department.

3. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel

Blaine Coleman, P.O. Box 7038, addressed Council regarding Israel. He urged Council to support a boycott of Israel due to their massacres of innocent Palestinian people.

4. Kermit Schlansker - Priorities

Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall St., addressed Council regarding their priorities as they relate to solar energy. He said that investments in windmills is not necessarily a good idea. He urged Council to be progressive and innovative in their plans for alternative energy investments.

5. Mozhgan Savabieasfahani - Boycott Israel

Mozhgan Savabieasfahani, P.O. Box 7038, addressed Council regarding boycotting Israel. She said that Israel is a country fully supported by the U.S., despite their human rights record. She urged a boycott.

6. Aina Bernier - Ann Arbor Dog Park

Aina Bernier, 803 Brooks St., spoke in support of a proposed dog park in West Park. She stated that a centrally-located dog park is needed and wanted by residents. Ms. Bernier stated that residents should not have to drive to Swift Run Park in order to exercise their dogs.

7. John Lawter - Dog Park

John Lawter, 1320 Orkney Dr., expressed concerned by the decision to reject a proposed dog park site at West Park, based on the concerns of the New Hope Baptist Church. He asked that the congregation be open to compromise and that the City and church work together to find a solution that satisfies both the church and local residents and dog owners.

8. Melissa Stults - Dog Park

Melissa Stults, 2320 Walter Dr., spoke in support of the proposed West Park dog park. She stated more dog parks and off-leash locations are needed throughout the City. She urged City leaders to find a creative solution and to work with the church to find a compromise for the West Park site.

9. Virginia Gordon - Dog Park

Virginia Gordon, 521 Cherry St., spoke in support of the development of new off-leash dog parks within the City. She stated these dog parks should be within neighborhoods and easily accessible to local dog owners. Ms. Gordon stated many other large cities have off-leash dog hours or established park areas for dogs.

10. Harold Kirchen - Dog Park

Harold Kirchen, 340 8th St., spoke in support of the development of new off-leash dog parks in Ann Arbor.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm announced that meetings with AATA's Urban Core Leaders are scheduled for this week. The meetings will consist of AATA staff, Ann Arbor councilmembers, Ypsilanti Township officials, Ypsilanti City councilmembers and the Ypsilanti Mayor. Councilmember Lumm suggested inviting AATA to a City Council working session.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere updated Council on the Public Art Task Force. She stated the Task Force has met four times and are currently discussing their concerns with the existing ordinance. She said possible changes and revisions to the Public Art and Boards and Commissions ordinances are being debated. Creative solutions for how public art is proposed and administered in the City are being considered.

COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin commented on the January 14 Council Working Session that included a presentation on the Connecting William Street project by the DDA. He thanked the DDA and staff for the presentation. Councilmember Anglin urged members of the public to make certain that their opinions and voices are heard, including on the issue of a new downtown park or green space on one of the sites.

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski responded to public comments that were made regarding his professional opinions as director of the Interfaith Council for Peace and Justice and his actions as a Councilmember as it relates to the Israeli/Palestinian conflict. Councilmember Warpehoski stated that he will not be weighing in on this issue while the protests continue at local synagogues.

Councilmember Warpehoski stated that the City's Environmental Commission will be hosting a public hearing on the City's Solid Waste Plan on January 24, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. He encouraged the public to come to the hearing and provide their opinions.

MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje reported on the Delonis Center's service to the City's homeless population. Mayor Hieftje stated that the shelter has not turned away anyone who wanted or needed shelter. Accommodations have also been made for those who may be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

City Administrator Steve Powers stated he invited Washtenaw County Sheriff Jerry Clayton to tonight's meeting to provide Council an update on the transition to countywide dispatch services.
