Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, spoke in support of the proposed bike share agreement. He stated this is a good start towards more non-motorized transportation.

Blaine Coleman, 1501 Ardmoor Avenue, spoke in support of the Resolution to Repeal Michigan's Stand Your Ground Law. He stated more money should be spent on rebuilding urban areas than needless wars.

Mozhgan Savabieasfahni, Ann Arbor resident, spoke about racism in the United States and the need to repeal Stand Your Ground laws.

5. Meghan Clark - Surveillance and Privacy

Meghan Clark, 1st Ward resident, expressed concerns about privacy and surveillance. She stated she was disappointed that City Council did not approve the Surveillance Ordinance. She stated privacy guidelines are needed and the concern is real.

6. Lucia Heinold - Repeal of Michigan's Stand Your Ground Law Resolution (DC-2)

Lucia Heinold, 1224 Wines Drive, spoke in support of the Resolution to Repeal Michigan's Stand Your Ground Law.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere provided Council with an update from the North Main Huron River Task Force. She stated the task force has met steadily for the last year, but they are not quite ready with their final report to Council. She stated they are meeting one last time on August 14 at 5:00 p.m. in the basement of City Hall to review their draft report. Following this review, the draft will be submitted to City Council.

Councilmember Briere stated the Ordinance Review Committee of the Planning Commission was meeting to review the D1 zoning process. There will also be a working session of the entire Planning Commission to review the non-motorized transportation plan.

COUNCILMEMBER PETERSEN

Councilmember Petersen updated Council on the Commission on Disability Issues. The United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNISDR) is conducting a survey to ascertain the needs of persons living with disabilities and disasters and the City has provided a link to the survey on the City website on the Disabilities Resources Page.

COUNCILMEMBER TEALL

Councilmember Teall updated Council on several Housing Commission projects, including a weatherization project at Hikone and new tenant windows at Baker Commons. She stated there is also a new non-smoking policy that will be implemented at all Housing Commission properties.

COUNCILMEMER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin updated Council regarding community outreach efforts, including a grass roots community meeting that took place at a church on Jefferson and Fourth. He stated these community meetings focus on neighborhood concerns.
