# **City Council**

### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

### MOMENT OF SILENCE

Council stood for a moment of silence.

Mayor Hieftje led Council in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

### COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

MAY 6, 2014 SPECIAL ELECTION

*City Administrator Steve Powers announced that City polling places would open on Tuesday, May 6, 2014 at 7:00 a.m. and remain open until 8:00 p.m. for voters to cast ballots in the Special Election regarding the proposed AAATA Transit Millage.* 

### ASBESTOS REMOVAL PROJECT

*Mr.* Powers said that noises from the asbestos removal project on the third floor may be heard during the meeting.

Mayor Hieftje said the asbestos abatement project is being done with all due caution; everything has been thoroughly sealed and the air is continually monitored.

*Mr.* Powers recognized the Ann Arbor Fire Department for its 125 Year Anniversary. In 1889, the City decided to form one organized Fire Department and began hiring full-time firefighters, as the start of today's Ann Arbor Fire Department, he said. 1. Tom Partridge - Expand affordable transportation opportunities. Vote for the millage to improve AAATA transportation on May 6th. (F-3, F-10 & G-6)

Tom Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, spoke in support of the AAATA ballot proposal and urged others to vote in favor.

### 2. Kermit Schlansker - Bio Mass Energy

Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, addressed Council regarding bio mass energy. He said that bio mass fills in for solar and wind when they are absent. It can fulfill the energy needs of a large building, while creating enough liquid fuel to power farm tractors and other machinery.

### 3. Lu Anne Bullington - Transportation

Lu Anne Bullington, 1801 South Blvd., addressed Council regarding transportation issues and the RTA. She expressed concern about the proposed bus millage on Tuesday's ballot, as well as a future regional transportation millage that may be coming soon. Ann Arbor has one of the highest transportation millages in Michigan, said Ms. Bullington.

# 4. Frank Burdick - Professional Services Agreement with CDM Smith Michigan, Inc. for the Footing Drain Disconnection Program (DS-1)

Frank Burdick, 2049 Winsted Blvd., addressed Council regarding the Professional Services Agreement with CDM Smith Michigan, Inc. for the Footing Drain Disconnection Program. He asked that Council vote no on the proposed agreement. He said that CDM Smith's performance in the design, implementation and the oversight of the program has been unacceptable to many Ann Arbor residents. The amount of money proposed to be spent on this contract is not necessary, he said.

### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER TEALL

Councilmember Teall stated the current State Street detour route between Granger and Stimson has not been well received. She asked the City Administrator to look

#### into this plan.

Councilmember Teall asked that staff look into the status of the Georgetown Mall Site and report back.

Councilmember Teall said a meeting regarding the coordinated funding process with Washtenaw County was held recently. Those agencies being funded would be notified this week and the funding request will go to the County on Wednesday night. Councilmember Teall thanked all those involved in the process.

### COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin talked about the AAATA Transportation Millage and the AAATA expansion. He said that he is able to support the expansion to the east of Ann Arbor because the public and these communities want the bus service.

### COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman said that he became aware of a company by the name of Uber, which is a ride sharing program. Uber pairs a driver using their personal vehicle, with riders who need transportation. The pairing is done using a smart phone application. He said that this company has made the news across the country and has run into a number of regulatory issues in many states including the State of Michigan. He said that the State of Michigan has sent them a cease and desist order, as has the City of Detroit. He asked that the Ann Arbor City Attorney's Office also send a cease and desist order to Uber. However, if it requires a Council action to request that, he would bring a resolution to Council at the next meeting.

### COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm announced that tomorrow, Tuesday, May 6, is a match day for the Ann Arbor Community Foundation. She urged those who could to contribute to their charities tomorrow through AACF.
