Kingsley Lane, spoke in support, stating safety should be the number one consideration. Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, spoke in opposition and urged Council not to take away rights of residents to have easement gardens. Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt Drive, stated she is a master gardner, but the number

one priority in this ordinance should be a focus on safety.

Linda Evans, Vice-Chair of the Commission on Disability Issues, expressed concern about the amendment that removes financial and physical hardship exemptions. She also expressed concern regarding the 1" snow removal requirement. She urged Council to comply with the ADA. Carolyn Grawi, Director of the CIL, spoke in opposition, stating the proposed

amendments do not comply with ADA. She urged Council to adopt a zero tolerance policy regarding snow on sidewalks.

Lloyd Sheldon, member of the Commission on Disability Issues, urged Council to amend the ordinance to require zero tolerance for snow on the sidewalk. Daniel Heumann, City resident, expressed concern about the ability to traverse Ann Arbor after a snowfall.

Peter Houk, Washtenaw Walking and Bicycling Coalition, spoke in opposition, stating a fix is needed, but this ordinance is not it. He urged Council to pass an ordinance that requires clear sidewalks.

Tony Pinnell, Pedestrian Safety and Access Task Force member Vince Caruso, 556 Glendale Puth Parlam, 2015 2, Junya Parlaman angles in annasition station the

Ruth Barkan, 2215 S. Huron Parkway, spoke in opposition, stating the ordinance as proposed is a violation of the ADA.

The following person was present to speak in support:

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, spoke in support, but urged Council to consider a zero tolerance policy. He urged Council to set the example with the City streets and sidewalks and do the same job that is asked of residents.
