COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere announced that the Idling Ordinance that Council previously considered a few years ago would be coming forward again soon. She is working with the City Attorney's Office to draft language regarding a revised version.

COUNCILMEMBER EATON

Councilmember Eaton said that the Ann Arbor Township Board of Trustees is discussing whether to petition the EPA to create a superfund site regarding the Pall Gelman plume. He asked that colleagues on the Environmental Commission discuss this issue and that the Environmental Commission advise Council on a position.

Councilmember Briere said that the Resolution in front of the Ann Arbor Township Board is a Resolution to support such an effort in the event than an effort is made. They are not exactly creating a petition to the EPA for a superfund site, but recommending that if the County or the City moves in that direction, that they want to provide political support. She said that she would report this back to the Environmental Commission for discussion and keep Council informed.

Councilmember Lumm said that designating the City as a superfund site could have all sorts of ramifications. She asked that the Environmental Commission and others studying the possibility of a superfund site provide Council with any important information on potential impacts to property values, the City's tax base and other related economic impacts.

COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith said that State Representative Jeff Irwin would be hosting a town hall meeting on April 18, 2016 beginning at 6 p.m. at Eberwhite Elementary School, 800 Soule Blvd, regarding the 1,4 Dioxane Plume. DEQ Director Keith Creagh will be in attendance and it would be a great opportunity to ask questions regarding dioxane, he said.

MAYOR TAYLOR

Mayor Taylor updated the public on the search for a new City Administrator. The Council Administration Committee met this afternoon and at that meeting, they reviewed and considered applications for a new City Administrator. The committee recommended that they review four of the applications as potential finalists; directed the consultant to contact the applicants; and directed the Human Resources Director to publicly release the names and biographical information of those applicants that have agreed to be public finalists, as soon as possible after the group is determined. They also directed the HR Director to set up internal and external interview panels, public receptions, Council interviews, as well as tours of the City for the finalists. They also recommended a fifth applicant as an alternant finalist for the search process to be added as a potential finalist, in the event that one of the four selected chooses not to proceed in the process. Mayor Taylor said that the release of the public finalists is anticipated to be this week or early next week and tentative dates for the interview process are April 14-16, with details to follow from the HR Director.

He thanked Council for passing DC-9. He noted that there were additional issues at play that both the DDA and Board need to look at regarding DC-9.
