#### 1. Aaron Burman - Invest in Recycling within City Budget

Aaron Burman, 818 Third Street, spoke about recycling efforts and encouraged the City Council to use Solid Waste Fund Balance to innovate and create new programs in recycling and organics recovery.

#### 2. John Kotarski - Public Art (CA-13)

John Kotarski, Chair of the Ann Arbor Art Commission, spoke in support of CA-13, regarding artist selection services.

3. Kathy Griswold - Resolution to Redirect Staff Resources and Funding from the Morehead-Delaware Pedestrian Bridge Project to the Changing Driving Culture Study and Installation of Additional Enhanced Pedestrian Crosswalks (DC-5)

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt, spoke in support of CA-14 and also the funding of

DC-5 and pedestrian infrastructure in the City.

#### 4. Susan Hutton - Budget

Susan Hutton, 1105 Olivia, Chair of Environmental Commission, spoke in support of the City Administrator's recommended budget and the inclusion of a new position in Solid Waste and a new position to support sustainability.

#### 5. Janet Wolfe - Mallett's Creek Bridge

Janet Wolfe, 2167 Mershon, spoke about DC-5, the bridge from Morehead Street to Delaware, in the Lansdowne Neighborhood. She urged Council to fund and support this bridge just like any City park.

#### 6. Nancy Ogilvie - Budget for Climate Action Plan

Nancy Ogilvie, 2328 Fernwood, spoke about climate change and encouraged the City Council to include funding for a staff person to implement the City's Climate Action Plan.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere spoke about projects that really work, such as the creation of the Argo Cascades several years ago. However, she stated the Cascades have created problems in the neighborhood regarding parking issues. Councilmember Briere stated she is hosting a meeting at Northside Grill on April 26 at 6:30 p.m. to allow residents the opportunity to discuss this issue with City staff.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WESTPHAL

Councilmember Westphal spoke about the recommendations of the Pedestrian Safety and Access Task Force and how to implement some of the priority items. One item was the use of cell phones in cars. He noted that April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month. He stated he plans to reintroduce an ordinance regarding cell phone use while driving.

#### COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm spoke about commercial quadricycles, sometimes known as pedal pubs. She stated the liquor committee is looking at this issue and plans to introduce an ordinance to regulate them. She stated the committee hopes to have a draft to Council by early May.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski thanked State Representative Jeff Irwin for organizing a public event to discuss the 1,4 Dioxane Plume. Regarding the Council Rules, Councilmember Warpehoski suggested that the Rules Committee look at an opportunity for response from Council after Public Comment General Time.

#### COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand spoke about the upcoming Washtenaw Intermediate School District special education millage on the May 3 ballot and encouraged residents to vote.

Whereas, The City has been presented with an opportunity to participate in the Changing Driving Culture Study with Western Michigan University, the results of which may improve driver yielding rates at pedestrian crosswalks resulting in an overall increase in safety;

Whereas, The City's cost to participate in the Changing Driving Culture Study is approximately \$150,000;

Whereas, On May 18, 2015 per budget amendment 9, City Council amended the Public Services Administration expenditure budget and the General Capital Project fund revenue and expenditure budgets were increased by \$450,000 to fund the Morehead-Delaware Pedestrian Bridge Project; and

Whereas, The Morehead-Delaware pedestrian bridge project has commenced and has a remaining unspent project budget of approximately \$438,000; RESOLVED, The City Administrator shall direct staff to remove the concrete

sidewalk and steps and reseed the area;

RESOLVED, The City Administrator shall direct staff to work with the staff of the Washtenaw County Water Resources Office in particular and other agencies as appropriate to investigate potential funding partnerships for the design and replacement of the Moreheard-Delaware pedestrian bridge;

RESOLVED The City Administrator shall direct staff to stop work on the

Morehead- Delaware Pedestrian Bridge Project;

RESOLVED, The City Administrator shall direct staff to engage with Western Michigan University to negotiate an agreement that outlines the responsibilities of both parties in regards to the proposed Changing Driving Culture Study; RESOLVED, The City Administrator shall direct staff to proceed with the engineering analysis, prioritization, and installation of additional RRFBs, as identified in the 2013 Non-Motorized Transportation Plan Update; RESOLVED, That the remaining \$438,000 approved for the Morehead-Delaware Pedestrian Bridge Project be reallocated to projects budgets for the Changing Driving Culture Study (\$150,000) ,the installation of additional RRFBs (\$268,000), and to the removal of sidewalk and concrete steps leading to the former bridge (\$20,000) ; and

RESOLVED, That Council authorizes the City Administrator to take the necessary administrative actions to implement this resolution.

Following further discussion, the amendment was further amended, to include only the following new RESOLVED clause:

RESOLVED, the City Administrator shall direct staff to work with the staff of the Washtenaw County Water Resources Office in particular and other agencies as appropriate to investigate potential funding partnerships;

The amendment as further amended was considered friendly.
