Mayor Taylor called the meeting of the Ann Arbor City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron Street.

City Administrator Howard Lazarus presented his Agenda Response Memo to Council and reported on the following:

Michigan's Best Tasting Water: The Michigan American Water Works Association has awarded the City of Ann Arbor with the Best Tasting Water in the State at its recent annual conference. The City initially won the southeast Michigan regional competition held in May 2016 and then went on to compete against the other regional winners, Bergland Township (in the Upper Peninsula), Chelsea, Mancelona and MHOG (Marion, Howell, Oceola and Genoa). The City of Ann Arbor last won this award in 1996. Congratulations to the Water Treatment Services staff!

Distinguished Budget Presentation Award: The City of Ann Arbor has received the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for the current budget from the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA). The award is the highest form of recognition in governmental budgeting and represents a significant achievement for our organization. Congratulations to our Financial Services Unit staff and Ms. Karen Lancaster!
