Moved by Beeson, seconded by White, that the Commission issue a certificate of appropriateness for the application at 330 South Main Street, a contributing property in the Main Street Historic District, to construct a new barrier-free ramp in front of the building. As proposed, the work is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, texture, material and relationship to the rest of the house and the surrounding area and meets The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, in particular standards 1, 9 and 10 and the guidelines for Entrances, and the Ann Arbor Historic District Design Guidelines for Barrier Free Accommodations.

The work as conditioned is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, texture, material and relationship to the rest of the building and the surrounding area and meets the Ann Arbor Historic District Design Guidelines for storefronts and signs, and The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, in particular standards 2, 5, and 9 and the guidelines for storefronts, windows, and building site.
