Moved by Cope, seconded by White, that the Commission issue a certificate of appropriateness for the application at 303 South Ashley Street, a contributing property in the Main Street Historic District, to add a fixed canopy with removable panels, as proposed. The work is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, texture, material and relationship to the rest of the building and the surrounding area and meets the Ann Arbor Historic District Design Guidelines for all additions, and The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, in particular standards 1, 2, 9 and 10 and the guidelines for building site and neighborhood setting.

Moved by Quijano, seconded by White, that the Commission issue a certificate of appropriateness for the application at 240 Crest, a contributing property in the Old West Side Historic District, to undertake repair and restoration work, construct a two-story rear addition, add a deck between the addition and historic house, and add a saddle to the roof and garage door to the rear of the attached garage on the following conditions: addition windows are wood or wood clad, the deck is wood or imitation wood, and parking is not permitted in the backyard. The work as conditioned is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, materials, and relationship to the house and the surrounding area and meets the City of Ann Arbor Historic District Design Guidelines for All Additions, and The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, in particular standards 2, 9 and 10 and the guidelines for New Additions, District or Neighborhood Setting, Building Site, and Windows.

Moved by Hall, seconded by White, that the Commission issue a certificate of appropriateness for the application at 403 West Liberty, a contributing property in the Old West Side Historic District, to remove all fire escapes, unblock infilled windows, install several egress windows in wells, replace concrete porch steps with wood, replicate original porch skirting, construct a new rear porch and stair to an existing door, lower the non-original hump on the roof and add a skylight to it, construct a three-car carport, add pavers and a patio, and add a 30" high wrought iron fence along the two street fronts, as proposed. The work is compatible in exterior design, arrangement, materials, and relationship to the house and the surrounding area and meets the City of Ann Arbor Historic District Design Guidelines and The Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation and Guidelines for Rehabilitating Historic Buildings, in particular standards 2, 9 and 10 and the guidelines for District or Neighborhood Setting, Building Site, Health and Safety, and Windows.
