Lauren Merz, 1233 Island Drive, a medical student at the University of Michigan, spoke in support of the Ordinance, stating the need to protect children.

Anastasia Hryhorczuk, a medical doctor and resident at 3308 Dobson Place spoke in support.

Ken Pituch, pediatric palliative care doctor at the University of Michigan Children's Hospital, spoke in support. He stated he has supported medical marijuana for children in certain cases, but still supports location restrictions.

Kai Petainen, resident, also noted that the public hearing was not noticed to the public prior to the meeting.

Jeremy Adler, physician at the University of Michigan, spoke in support, stating there is a detrimental effect on children unnecessarily exposed to marijuana at an early age.

M. Grace Boxer, Waldenwood Drive, and physician at the University of Michigan, spoke in support.

An unidentified speaker working as a preschool director spoke in support. Ryan Dybdahl, 1216 Broadway, spoke in support. He urged Council not to normalize marijuana use any more than it already has been.

An employee of UM Hospital spoke in support and urged Council to protect children.

Allison Long, resident, spoke in support.

Angela Weyand, Ward 5 physician, spoke in support.

Brian Fenech, Ward 4, spoke in opposition, noting that dispensaries have been operating in Ann Arbor for over a decade. He asked for statistics regarding marijuana and children from Ann Arbor.
