Tim Hull, 2475 Lancashire Dr., Apt 2B, urged Council to pass DC-2 and to support transit-oriented planning.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER NELSON

Councilmember Nelson thanked all of the members of the community that are utilizing their 3-D printers in an effort to make additional PPE equipment for local hospitals through the project protect-mi.org. She encouraged others who are able to get involved.

COUNCILMEMBER GRISWOLD

Councilmember Griswold thanked City Staff, including Infrastructure and Cybersecurity Manager Jen Grimes, for all their hard work during the pandemic to transition to electronic meetings and to keep essential services open.

COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner thanked everyone for their efforts in social distancing and helping to flatten the curve.

Councilmember Hayner discussed the efforts that the City is taking to help residents but also acknowledged there are certain limitations on what the City can provide. He stated he wanted to assure residents that Council and City Administration are working with the State and County partners to help address areas the City cannot directly address.

COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi recognized Eppie Potts for her years of dedicated service to the City.

Councilmember Ramlawi thanked Tom Crawford for his work as Interim City Administrator in these most difficult times. He urged restraint from the Council to allow the Administration to ensure that the City's scare resources are best deployed.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm thanked the City staff, especially first responders, for their work during these difficult times.

Councilmember Lumm recognized Destination Ann Arbor for their worked with area hotels to help address overcrowding in the homeless centers, as well as providing housing for medical workers.

Councilmember Lumm acknowledged all the hard work and planning that the University of Michigan Hospital administration and staff had previously accomplished and continues to accomplish regarding the pandemic response.

COUNCILMEMBER BANNISTER

Councilmember Bannister thanked all of the Ward One residents that have reached out to her and Councilmember Hayner with questions and concerns.

Councilmember Bannister thanked Councilmember Griswold for her work in helping facilitate holding Council Caucus electronically.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand acknowledged and recognized the AAPS teachers as they work to facilitate remote learning and the AAPS district for their work in providing food and resources to the most vulnerable in our community.
