CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Christopher Taylor called the electronic meeting of the Ann Arbor City Council to order at 7:01 p.m. in accordance with Governor Gretchen Whitmer's Executive Order 2020-129.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

Council stood for a moment of silence.

Mayor Taylor led Council in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

> Blaine Coleman, PO Box 7038, spoke in support of Mozhgan Savabieasfahani's candidacy for Ward 4 Councilmember, stating she is

the environmental choice.

6. Peter Houk - Resolution to Endorse HB 4738 and the Creation of a Statewide Crosswalk Law (DC-11)

Peter Houk, 2025 Yeoman Ct., spoke in opposition to DC-11, stating it undoes the progress that the City crosswalk ordinance provides.

7. Shannon Hautamaki - Healthy Streets (DC-3 & 4)

Shannon Hautamaki, 1110 Brooklyn, thanked the City Parks Department for its efforts to ensure a sense of normalcy during the pandemic. She urged the passage of DC-3 and DC-4 to help allow more space to in neighborhoods for social distancing and exercise.

8. Ruth Spalding - Independent Community Police Oversight Commission (ICPOC) (INT-1) & Analysis of the Financial Feasibility of Developing Affordable Housing on Under-utilized City-owned Property (AC-1)

Ruth Spalding, 2109 Medford, discussed the lack of integration of the Independent Community Police Oversight Commission into the City's decision-making processes.

9. Tom Stulberg - Temporary Moratorium on all New Development or Expansion of Existing Development that Requires Site Plan Approval in the C1A and C1A/R Zoning Districts, or Rezonings to the C1A or C1A/R Zoning Districts (DC-9)

Tom Stulberg, 1202 Traver St., spoke in favor of DC-9 and the need for a comprehensive review of the zoning requirements in the City.

10. Ralph McKee - Temporary Moratorium on all New Development or Expansion of Existing Development that Requires Site Plan Approval in the C1A and C1A/R Zoning Districts, or Rezonings to the C1A or C1A/R Zoning Districts (DC-9)

> Ralph McKee, 1116 Red Oak, urged City Council to follow the lead of Dr. Lisa Jackson regarding the City's Police Union contract. He also spoke in support of DC-9. He urged Council to postpone DS-1 to gather additional input on the project.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner discussed his desire to bring forth a local

ordinance to require electrification of new home construction, in support of the A2Zero Net Neutrality Plan.

Councilmember Hayner also discussed his desire to see the "Rooney" rule enacted, to ensure that at least one minority candidate is interviewed for all non-union management positions.

Councilmember Hayner discussed the potential for pandemic-related ordinances, including a local mask ordinance and an eviction prevention ordinance.

COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith stated that he, Mayor Taylor and Councilmember Nelson have been working to craft language for an affordable housing ballot proposal in November. It is their hope to have the full text of the millage available for Council's approval at the next meeting.

COUNCILMEMBER GRISWOLD

Councilmember Griswold discussed her actions at the last special meeting and whether or not it was professional behavior.

Councilmember Griswold discussed the County's recent resolution declaring that racism is a public health crisis. She will be bringing forth a resolution to reaffirm the County's resolution by the City, she stated.

Councilmember Griswold discussed her desire to see additional Park staffing at the Cascades to oversee public behavior.

Councilmember Griswold also discussed the need for public input if video surveillance of the roads is to take place.

COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi discussed the downtown street closures and the recent rise in cases of COVID. He stated that the City Administrator, Councilmember Lumm, and himself are in regular contact with the Merchant Associations and the DDA. The City Administrator does have the authority to discontinue the use of public streets for dining should the public health risk dictate a need, he stated.

Councilmember Ramlawi discussed the possibility of repurposing some of the Greenbelt millage dollars for affordable housing.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand stated that a resolution to confirm Jason Boggs, as the real estate professional representative on the Greenbelt Advisory Commission, with be on the next agenda for confirmation.

Councilmember Grand also discussed the statements from the Student Advisory Council, which were in line with what Dr. Jackson recommended in regard to the Ann Arbor Police Officers' Association Collective Bargaining Agreement.

COUNCILMEMBER BANNISTER

Councilmember Bannister stated that there will be a "Finding Your Political Voice" event this Saturday from 4-5:30 p.m. at the Arrowwood basketball court featuring Police Chief Michael Cox.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm thanked Councilmember Ramlawi for providing an update on the downtown meetings with the Merchant Associations.

Councilmember Lumm discussed the proposed affordable housing millage and the potential for re-purposing Greenbelt funds. She indicated that the re-purposing of the funds would still require a vote of the citizens in order to modify the approved use of the Greenbelt millage money.

Councilmember Lumm also reminded residents that they have the flexibility to pay their summer tax bills until August without penalty. The penalty for payment in September has been reduced from 5% to 2.5%, but will not be reported as a late payment.

COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMANN

Councilmember Ackermann reminded residents that absentee ballots are hitting mailboxes for individuals who have submitted applications. He urged the use of absentee ballots in the August Primary to help stop the spread of COVID-19. He also noted that Council would be voting tonight to move the Scarlett Middle School polling location to Mitchell Elementary School for the August 4th Primary for the voters in Precinct 3-6 & 3-9, who choose to vote in person.
