Councilmember Hayner stated he called for order regarding a Roll Call Vote because the Rules were not followed, and the City Clerk was interrupted.

COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi stated he comes to the meetings prepared, but does not appreciate late additions to the agenda, noting that he and others work over the weekends.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand addressed a public comment regarding racism in the public schools.

COUNCILMEMBER NELSON

Councilmember Nelson addressed the confusion around a roll call vote. She stated she understands that new members can have questions, and for those who were new to Council this year starting on Zoom could be even more challenging.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIGGS

Councilmember Briggs noted that DC-5, which she sponsored, was not late according to current Rules. She urged the Administration Committee to look at agenda timelines if the current system is not working.

ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Councilmember Griswold, seconded by Councilmember Song, that the meeting adjourn. On a voice vote, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 10:49 p.m.
