# E COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ATTORNEY

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)**

Joe Spaulding, of Holland, Michigan, spoke about the role of social media in Council relations.

*Melanie Welch, resident, spoke about CA-19 and her Insurance Board complaint. She stated this is not a builder dispute.* 

A UM student and athlete expressed his disappointment that Public Commentary General Time is so late in the meeting. He stated it creates more barriers to participation.

Kitty Kahn, resident, stated she cannot comprehend the vote on DC-3, regarding snow plow, noting the resolution was only to study the feasibility. She stated it should have been a "no-brainer."

Ralph McKee, Ward 5, spoke about the Gelman plume. He urged Council to send a letter to the EPA.

Louis Vasquez, Ward 1, spoke about the vote regarding Conor O'Neill's St. Patrick's Day event. He stated this is premature.

Shannon Hautamaki, resident, spoke about the Conor O'Neill's event, stating it is very premature. She expressed frustration at the fact that this type of event would be approved while the public schools remain closed due to the pandemic.

Tom Stulberg, resident, spoke about the approval of the outdoor event at Conor O'Neill's. He stated a "super spreader" event at this point would hurt the entire community.

*Eric Sturgis, Ward 1, spoke in opposition to CA-12, the event at Conor O'Neill's. He also stated the referral of DC-2, regarding pedestrian snow plow, was a disappointment.* 

Linda Berauer, Ward 5, spoke about DC-2 and snow removal in the community.

## COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER DISCH

Councilmember Disch addressed the public's concern regarding the City's response to the Gelman situation, and the City's original plans to pursue parallel paths with EPA Super Fund status. She stated Congresswoman Dingell has indicated this is not possible.

## COUNCILMEMBER GRISWOLD

Councilmember Griswold apologized to the Mayor for sharing communications between them, stating she did it as it was her understanding the communications were subject to the FOIA process.

## COUNCILMEMBER HAYNER

Councilmember Hayner stated he and Councilmember Disch are attending a class regarding the Planning process. He also stated he has been a part of the Gelman process and attending CARD meetings from very early on; he stated he will share his history on the situation.

# COUNCILMEMBER RAMLAWI

Councilmember Ramlawi expressed his disappointment in the lack of support by Council for his initiatives.

## COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand stated her vote on CA-12 was not related to politics or ego. She stated this street closure offers a pilot opportunity for future events.

# COUNCILMEMBER BRIGGS

*Councilmember Briggs addressed her vote on CA-12, regarding the Conor O'Neill's street closure. She stated it was a difficult decision and*  she understands that strict social distancing protocols will be in place.

COUNCILMEMBER SONG

Councilmember Song addressed Councilmember Ramlawi's concerns, stating she is willing to work with him on mutual interests.

MAYOR TAYLOR

Mayor Taylor also discussed his vote on CA-12. He stated it was a difficult decision, but he noted the success of the outdoor dining last Fall during the pandemic.

## ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Councilmember Song, seconded by Councilmember Eyer, that the meeting adjourn. On a voice vote, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the meeting adjourned at 10:12 p.m.
