# 1. Thomas Partridge - Zoning Reforms Needed (I-5)

## **COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL**

COUNCILMEMBER TEALL

Councilmember Teall asked for clarification regarding the recent news report of uncapped taxes and the transfer of business between LLC companies.

Tom Crawford, CFO, said that properties like commercial properties owned by LLCs sometimes change ownership and on occasion the City is not aware of the transfer. The City Assessor's Unit has been aware of this for some time and the City has different ways to try and ensure that all transfers are being captured.

#### MAYOR HIEFTJE

Mayor Hieftje attended a meeting called by the Mayor of Dearborn regarding a proposed commuter rail and other projects that are coming together. It was a follow-up to a meeting held on May 14, 2010 with Senator Levin and Congressman Dingell. The report from the Federal Government was discussed. The federal government has issued more than \$2.7 billion in funds from the American Reinvestment Recovery Act. Of that \$2.7 billion grant, \$244 million will go toward building new rail stations in Dearborn, Troy and Battle Creek, as well as track improvements to lines in Ann Arbor, Detroit and Howell.

SEMCOG will present the finished rail cars soon. Trains will be available to run on a demonstration basis for events like the Thanksgiving Day parade and the UM/MSU hockey game, the Mayor said.

Mayor Hieftje also announced that they would be celebrating the birth of the Peace Corps in Ann Arbor 50 years ago. Two of the individuals that are coming to Ann Arbor are the current director of the Peace Corps, Aaron Williams, and the second director, now 90 years old, Jack Vaughn. Both have ties to Ann Arbor, both lived in the City of Ann Arbor, and attended the University of Michigan.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin spoke about the City's stormwater conditions. Councilmember Anglin stated he had met with staff recently who had prepared a very nice presentation on the existing conditions. Councilmember Anglin thanked City staff for the informative presentation and the progress that has been made.

## COUNCILMEMBER DEREZINSKI

Councilmember Derezinski reported that the Ann Arbor Housing Commission recently visited Grand Rapids, Michigan to study the Housing Commission there. They met with staff and visited four different facilities in the area. Councilmember Derezinski stated the folks from Ann Arbor were impressed with what Grand Rapids had done in the area of housing, both subsidized, homeless housing, as well as senior housing.

They learned a lot, and some of it would be applicable to Ann Arbor, he stated.

#### LEAF MULCHING DEMO AND GIVE AWAY

The City of Ann Arbor will host a leaf mulching demonstration and mower give-away on October 10, 2010 from 1-2:30 p.m. at Wheeler Park Shelter at Summit and Fourth Ave. near the Amtrak Station. Staff from Carpenter Brothers Hardware will demonstrate how to mulch leaves into the lawn, as opposed to raking, followed at 2 p.m. with an onsite drawing to give away a mulching mower. ## PASSAGE OF UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE ORDINANCE

In response to the recent passage of the city ordinance that prohibits the outdoor storage of upholstered furniture, a residential upholstered furniture collection event is being held starting October 22, through October 24, 2010 from noon to 5 p.m. each day at the intersection of E. University and Oakland Streets, for Ann Arbor residents and property managers only. Those leaving any other types of materials, depositing furniture from non Ann Arbor properties, or using the site during off hours are subject to illegal dumping fines. #### CITY CLERK'S OFFICE CLOSED TO PUBLIC

Ms. McCormick announced that as a part of the City's budget reduction strategies, the City Clerk's Office is scheduled to be closed on Fridays to the public in order to allow staff time to process voter registration and absentee ballot applications, with a reduced staff and less overtime available. Regular business hours for now are Monday through Thursday 8 am to 5 p.m. The office will re-open full time to the public on the Friday following the November 2 Election.

#### STATUS UPDATE MUNICIPAL CENTER PROJECT

The City/County data center has been relocated to the new Police/Court facility. The move went without incident over the weekend. The contractor will release the first area in the new building on October 8. This area will be housed by IT. IT will begin to move into the new space on October 11, 2010.

#### AIR MOVEMENT IN LARCOM BUILDING

The HVAC equipment on the 7th floor of the Municipal Building has been shut down for a planned three-week process of removing and replacing the equipment. The old equipment has been removed and the new equipment has been lifted into the mechanical room. The old Tio's lot next door to the Larcom Building has been paved and completed. Landscaping is in and City vehicles have re-occupied that area for parking.
