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Resolution Directing the City Administrator to Develop a Plan to Review and Increase the Utilization of the Poverty Exemption Program

Whereas, The City of Ann Arbor has adopted numerous resolutions that endeavor to increase housing affordability and improve social equity;

Whereas, Ann Arbor's average for-sale home price is nearly \$400,000.00, making home ownership unaffordable for households that earn less than \$85,000.00 per year;

Whereas, Ann Arbor is home to low-income homeowners that struggle to remain in our community;

Whereas, The City of Ann Arbor has instituted a Poverty Exemption program that waives property taxes for residents living near the federal poverty line;

Whereas, Many residents are unaware of the Poverty Exemption program; and

Whereas, The Poverty Exemption program is likely underutilized;

RESOLVED, That the City Council directs the City Administrator to develop a plan to review and increase the utilization of the Poverty Exemption program. Ideas for such a plan could include:

- 1. Increase advertisement through multiple channels, such as the City of Ann Arbor website, water bills, tax statements, press releases, and AAATA ads;
- 2. Raise the income threshold to accommodate more households; and
- 3. Reduce the complexity of informational materials and application.

RESOLVED, That the City Council requests that the City Administrator, or a designee, meet with relevant stakeholders, such as the Housing and Human Services Advisory Board (HHSAB), in developing this plan; and

RESOLVED, That the City Council directs the City Administrator to deliver this plan by December 31, 2020.
