*Tim Hull, resident, spoke about transportation issues, including the need for reliable bus service in middle class neighborhoods, not just around campus.*

*Kai Petainen, First Ward, spoke in support of a new train station, but urged Council to be transparent, honest, and to engage the public in the process.*

*Paula Uche, Ward Four, spoke about the safety of residents walking in the parks who may be unaware of the deer cull activities. She also spoke about the use of trains in Europe. Ms. Uche thanked Council for their support of DACA. She urged Council to declare Ann Arbor a sanctuary city.*

*An unidentified resident spoke in support of affordable housing and urged Council to address the affordability of downtown living. He also spoke about the future of autonomous vehicles and how that will affect transit.*
