1. Will the zoning change be permanent or will it revert back to the previous zoning designation if the new residents sell in the future?
2. Will the property be tax exempt since it has a religious affiliation or will it be on the previous property tax rolls ?
3. Can we please have the sign returned in front of the Wayne street entrance to Postman's rest park that limited parking to residential permits (Oxbridge) ? It was not replaced after the extensive street repair in the area in 2012 and now people park there and take the bus to campus. If the six residents will each have a car (parking was addressed extensively in the 17 page document associated with the appeal) it would be best to return the sign so they can use the neighborhood permit system to limit other parking.  
I found a photo on Google Maps with the previously posted sign if you need any proof.
4. The red lines illustrating parking on the photos for Wayne street may not be entirely accurate. Might need to re check.

We received the letter today from Magill and Rumsey representing the Petitioners (Jesuit Order of Ann Arbor) and we would support a one time zone change for these purchasers.
