

Ann Arbor Art Commission Subcommittee Special Meeting
February 9, 2016

- Commissioner Rizzolo-Brown inquired as to whether or not art could be related to a CIP project indirectly, e.g., adjacent to a site. At this point, we will not consider that.
- The commission reviewed 10 potential projects for enhancement.
 - 2 projects are past opportunity:
 - MF-CB-16-03: Housing Commission: 701-749 N Maple
 - MF-SW-10-03 Methane Gas Recovery Project
 - 1 project cannot be enhanced due to funding model:
 - TR-AP-10-01 Six Box Hangers
 - 1 project we have decided to table:
 - MF-PR-12-03 Farmers Market Winter Enclosure and Infrastructure Improvements
 - 4 projects require follow up:
 - MF-CB-16-04 Housing Commission: 3401-3481 Platt
 - Commissioner Smith will follow up with Jennifer Hall
 - Budget: \$80K
 - Proposal: Create a more vibrant community and engaged citizenry via whimsy, design elements, murals, etc. to streetscape or communal areas. Committee of city and citizenry to determine the best way to use the allotted \$\$\$ for this purpose.
 - MF-CB-17-01 Housing Commission: White/State/Henry
 - Commissioner Smith will follow up with Jennifer Hall
 - Budget: \$80K
 - Proposal: Create a more vibrant community and engaged citizenry via whimsy, design elements, murals, etc. to streetscape or communal areas. Committee of city and citizenry to determine the best way to use the allotted \$\$\$ for this purpose.
 - MF-CB-16-07 Commercial Corridors (Non-DDA) Street Framework Plan
 - Craig Hupy will get us more information on this.
 - MF-CB-16-06 Allen Creek Greenway Master Plan
 - Commissioner Rizzolo-Brown will follow up with Connie Pulcifer
 - Budget: TBD
 - Proposal: Art elements can be used to increase the pleasure and understanding of the route. They can educate, provide history and environmental knowledge as well as make it a great experience. How it might be employed: trail design, streetscape and path elements, art items, color, paving art, sculpture, light design, enhanced built elements, etc.
 - 2 projects we will put forward:

- MF-SW-06-03 Drop-off Station
 - Budget: \$60K - \$100K
 - Proposal: We propose a program that leverages principles of reuse, repurpose, and re-imagining on a periodic basis.
- TR-AT-01-07 Arboretum/Gallup Underpass
 - Budget: \$80K
 - Proposal: Provide a better tunnel experience through art and design to enliven the route, help users to feel safer and more confident, provide unexpected delights, educate or artfully provide wayfinding via surface treatment to the tunnels interior, entry elements, lighting, color, etc.
- Be it resolved: The Ann Arbor Public Art Commission recommends that Connie Rizzolo-Brown be liaison to the Allen Creek Greenway Conservancy. (Simpson / Smith)
- Commissioner Simpson will set up a Pinterest account for us to crowdsource examples.
- Craig Hupy will follow up on the following things and report back to Jim Simpson:
 - Depot Street Tunnel information
 - Swift Run Park
 - DDA streetscape framework
 - Roughness allowed for ADA
 - Manholes
 - Sanitary, Storm, Water, Generic - the four types of lids they buy
