Answer 2: No changes will be made to the required completion date.

Question 3: Will shop drawings be required for the Gallup Park structure or could we submit a

specific product submittal instead?

Yes, shop drawings are required unless a product submittal is accepted in lieu. Answer 3:

Question 4: If a structure is disassembled for field measurement, can it remain closed until

work begins?

Answer 4: No, if any structure is disassembled for field measuring, it is required to be

reassembled and opened for use until the actual construction begins.

Question 5: Will additional tree clearing be permitted?

The contractor is able to request additional tree clearing to be conducted by Park Answer 5:

Staff, and it will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Question 6: What is the access to the various structures?

Answer 6: Access to each structure varies and bidders are highly encouraged to visit the

structure sites in person.

Question 7: Are all of the bridge structures located on park property?

Yes, all bridge structures are located on park property, but the Mitchell Field Answer 7:

structure abuts land owned by the University of Michigan on its western bank.

Question 8: Are the vehicle lanes on the Gallup Park structure required to remain open during

construction?

Answer 8: The vehicle lanes of the Gallup Park structure can be closed during working hours,

but at least one pedestrian path must be open at all times, and the vehicle lanes

must be open during non-work hours.

Question 9: Is the Bandemer Park Vehicle structure quardrail to be replaced on all four

quadrants of the approaches? Can you provide additional details for the work

required on the approach railings? Are replacement approach terminals required?

Answer 9: Yes, the Bandemer Park Vehicle structure quardrail shall be replaced on all four quadrants of the approach, and on the structure itself. The short section of

guardrail between the vehicle and adjacent pedestrian structure shall remain. The proposed quardrail endings on the approaches and the structure shall be Terminal End Shoe, Type B, which are included in the Pay Item "Guardrail, Type B,

Modified."

Question 10: Are there any restrictions on barges or equipment in the waterway to facilitate

construction?

Answer 10: The City is not aware of any restrictions on barges or equipment in the waterway.

However, we do require that a portion of the waterway remain open as stated in

the specifications.

Examination of Plans, Specifications, and Work Site

The work of this project shall be completed while closing each structure to pedestrian and/or vehicle traffic (except for N. Barton Trail Pedestrian Structure, which shall remain open at all times, and except for one sidewalk on Gallup Park Vehicle Structure, which shall remain open at all times). See the Project Plans for additional information.

The Contractor is required to mobilize sufficient equipment and personnel, and work the necessary overtime, to complete the work within the timelines established herein. Phase 1:

2. Phase 1 consists of work associated with substantial completion of the Gallup Park Vehicle Structure, the North Barton Pedestrian Structure and the South Barton Pedestrian Structure and shall be completed by **Friday, March 27, 2020**. Substantial completion of Phase 1 includes all structures that were closed to traffic being reopened to full public access and usage.

Phase 2:

- 3. Phase 2 shall commence upon substantial completion of Phase 1, and with written approval from the Engineer. Phase 2 consists of work associated with substantial completion of the Bandemer Park Pedestrian Structure, Bandemer Park Vehicle Structure, Argo Park Pedestrian Structure and Mitchell Field Pedestrian Structure, and shall be completed by Monday, June 1, 2020. Substantial completion includes all structures that were closed to traffic being reopened to full public access and usage.
- 4. The entire work under this contract shall be completed by Monday, June 15, 2020.

The Contractor shall submit a detailed schedule of work (progress schedule) for the Engineer's review and approval, two weeks prior to beginning work. The schedule shall clearly indicate, in detail, the start and the finish date of each work task on each structure. deviations from the most current, approved, schedule.

The Contractor shall be furnished with two (2) copies of the Contract, for his/her execution, on or about <u>Monday</u>, <u>November 4</u>, <u>2019</u>. The Contractor shall properly execute both copies of the Contract and return them, with the required Bonds and Insurance Certificate, to the City by <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 13</u>, <u>2019</u>. The Contractor shall not begin the work before the applicable date(s) as described herein, and in no case before the receipt of the fully executed Contract. City Council approval is expected <u>Monday</u>, <u>December 2</u>, <u>2019</u>.

The temporary closure (less than 1 day in length, with prior City approval) of a structure will be allowed, if necessary, for the Contractor to obtain field measurements. The Contractor shall immediately return the structure to the same, useable condition as it was before their work after any alterations/removal of components (decking, railing, etc.) are completed for these purposes

Failure to complete the work as specified, within the times specified, including time extensions granted thereto as determined by the Engineer, shall entitle the City to deduct from the payments due the Contractor \$900.00 in "Liquidated Damages", and not as a penalty, for each and every calendar day the work remains incomplete beyond the date specified. The length of time that each structure is closed to traffic shall be kept to the shortest duration possible so that disruptions to trail and park users are kept to a minimum. The Contractor shall not close a structure until all materials, equipment and labor is sufficient and available, in a continuous timeframe, to make constant progress and complete the work and reopen the structure as quickly as possible.

Description.

This work consists of providing all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to furnish and install the Type B Guardrail at the Bandemer Park Vehicle Structure and approaches, as indicated on the drawings and this Detailed Specification. Ensure all work is performed in accordance with this Detailed Specification, Section 807 of the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) 2012 Standard Specifications for Construction, Local and State Building Codes, and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Materials.

Provide all materials in accordance with Section 807 of the 2012 MDOT Standard Specifications for Construction. Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

.....

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular

rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

- 1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:
- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- st a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.)

and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:


