1. Robert McGee - Deer Sterilization Volunteers (AC-2)

Robert McGee, 2245 Placid Way, encouraged Council to continue to save the City's deer by continuing the sterilization program as opposed to culling.

2. Sabra Sanzotta - Deer Management Plan Regarding Neighborhoods (AC-2)

Sabra Sanzotta, 3087 Glazier Way, spoke in opposition to the deer cull taking place in neighborhood parks and backyards. She stated accidents can and do happen. She urged Council to proceed with caution.

3. Bill Burnham - Historic Preservation Ordinance Regarding Inglis House Historic District (C-1)

Bill Burnham, 2303 Highland, spoke about the Inglis House sale and urged Council to consider a postponement of the proposed historic district until deed restrictions could be placed on the property during the upcoming sale. He stated the deed restrictions are the preferred method of protecting the property versus the creation of an historic district.

4. Bridget Bly - Inglis House Project (C-1)

Bridget Bly, 12 Regent Drive, spoke in favor of a postponement of the Inglis House Historic District until the proposed deed restrictions could be put in place.

5. James D'Amour - A2 Commits to 100% Clean Energy (DC-2)

James D'Amour, 2771 Maplewood, spoke in support of DC-2, the City's commitment to 100% use of renewable resources for City operations.

6. Sara Abrams - Making the World a Better Place

Sara Abrams, 2745 Ember Way, spoke in opposition to the City's deer cull.

7. Sally Daniels - Public Safety

Sally Daniels, 1847 Packard, spoke in opposition to the City's deer cull, particularly regarding the elimination of the 450-foot rule. She stated residents' safety has been compromised.
