The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider the October 26, 2010 application of The Detroit Edison Company (Detroit Edison) for approval to defer certain pension and post-employment benefits (OPEB expense) expense for future amortization and recovery.

Detroit Edison forecasts that its 2011 and 2012 pension and other OPEB expense will be materially higher than the level of expense experienced in prior periods and reflected in its current retail electric rates. Detroit Edison proposes to defer the difference between the 2011 and 2012 actual pension and OPEB expense, compared to the expense levels reflected in current base rates. Detroit Edison also proposes to amortize the deferred 2011 and 2012 pension and OPEB

expense over a five year period, effective with the date new base rates are implemented in Edison's next rate case.

Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case, may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of his or her wish to make a statement of position. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's website, and subject to disclosure.
