Formal Inquiry Regarding Brady List

L. Jackson discussed the background related to the Brady List. S. Carter referred to June's meeting, regarding the NACOLE Webinar. Citing when an officer has not told the truth in a police report or other context. S. Carter has been advised by AAPD Professional Standards, they do not have a Brady List. Wayne County currently has a Brady List and shares their list with the community. The next step is to decide if a list comes within the purview of this commission.

NEW BUSINESS

Chief of Police Recruitment Process

L. Jackson acknowledge Interim Chief of Police, Aimee Metzger, Deputy Chief, Jason Forsberg and new Deputy Chief, Patrick Maguire.

L. Jackson discussed the recruitment process for the Chief of Police. ICPOC commissioners have been invited by the City Administrator to participate in the process prior to the City beginning their search for the next Chief. During the last process ICPOC was invited to the interview process. The commission hope to contribute the values we believe are important for a new chief. Operationalize a working relationship and discuss the criteria prior to the City selection process. ICPOC expect to be involved in interviewing potential finalist as well.

M. Othman stated the commission should be realistic about issues at hand, focus on increasing transparency and trust with the AAPD when it comes to picking a new police chief.

COMMUNICATIONS

M. Othman reported on the Information Managers. Presently there are only 4 commissioners to review all complaints. We are in the process of reviewing a template for complaint folders with our intern Debbie Erickson to help modify the next steps in the complaint process.

L. Jackson reported ICPOC is in the process of developing a website with a dashboard for the community, where the public can review the status of complaints. The website will go live in the near future.

Traffic Stop Data and The Southeast Michigan Criminal Justice Policy Research Project at Eastern Michigan University (SMART). The team is close to finalizing their analysis of Ann Arbor Traffic Stop Data from: 2017 through 2019. There will be a separate analysis for the COVID 2020 year. The team is waiting on crash data from the City of Ann Arbor to use as a benchmark for fair and through analysis followed by subsequent community meetings.

CM Song notified the commission of the event taking place tonight at the Downtown Library a Panel discussion with the Youth Justice Fund from 6:30 until 7:30 p.m. part of a series the Library is hosting.

M. Othman moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by R. Milgrom. Meeting adjourned at 6:39 p.m.
