**1. Bob Galardi - Resolution for Grant Application to Fund Improvements to 721 N. Main (DB-2)**

*Bob Galardi, 315 2nd Street #217, stated he is the current president of the Allen Creek Greenway Conservancy. He spoke in support of the City's efforts to apply for grants to make improvements to the 721 N. Main site.*

**2. Alice Ralph - Climate Action Plan (DB-3)**

*Alice Ralph, 1607 E. Stadium Blvd., spoke in support of the City's resolution to approve a Climate Action Plan. She also spoke in support of a resolution for additional engineering work and study at the 415 W. Washington site. She stated these resolutions, as well as the resolution to approve grant applications for 721 N. Main, will all support the Allen Creek Greenway.*

**3. Tom Partridge - What Would Jesus Say? Would Jesus not advocate budgeting to protect America's most vulnerable by expanding human rights, access to affordable transportation and housing?**

*Tom Partridge, City resident, spoke about human rights and affordable housing issues. He asked what would Jesus advocate for?*

**4. Kathy Griswold - 2012 Ramp and Sidewalk Repair Project (DS-2)**

*Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt Drive, spoke in support of the resolution for the 2012 Ramp and Sidewalk Repair project. She expressed concern with the plans for 2013 and urged Council to make changes. She spoke in opposition to the "Pedestrians Rule" campaign.*

**5. Susan Hutton - Climate Action Plan (DB-3)**

*Susan Hutton, 1102 Olivia Avenue, a member of the City Environmental Commission, spoke in support of the City's proposed Climate Action Plan.*

**6. Henry Herskovitz - 1st Amendment**

*Henry Herskovitz, 404 Mark Hannah Place, spoke about the issues surrounding Palestine and Israel. He criticized the response of the local interfaith peace group and its actions on this issue.*

**7. Blaine Coleman - Boycott Israel**

*Blaine Coleman, City resident, spoke about Palestine. He urged Council to act.*

**8. Lon Cooke - Vehicle Towing**

*Lon Cooke, 6441 Heron Court, Scio Township, spoke about his experience with a vehicle tow in Ann Arbor. He stated he had a \$280 charge for a vehicle towing in downtown Ann Arbor. He felt the towing was predatory and urged Council to change its practices.*

**9. Kermit Schlansker - Solar Rooftops**

*Kermit Schlansker, 2960 Marshall, spoke about alternative energy sources.*

**10. Wayne Appleyard - Climate Action Plan (DB-3)**

*Wayne Appleyard, 5750 Prospect Hill, chair of the Ann Arbor Energy Commission, spoke in support of the proposed Climate Action Plan.*

*Councilmember Anglin noted that there are three resolutions on tonight's agenda regarding the Allen Creek Greenway. He urged Council to remember the importance of these projects to the future of the Allen Creek watershed. He stated it is important to see these projects move forward and the preservation of the greenway continue.*

*Councilmember Taylor reported on the closing of a property purchased through the Greenbelt program. It is 20 acres on Joy Road and it is contiguous with 1200 acres of other protected property in Webster Township.*

*Mr. Powers reported on the State's recently approved changes to the personal property tax for businesses. He stated more information would be coming in the next few months regarding the budget impact to the City.*

*Regarding the recent elementary school attack out East, Mr. Powers reported that Police Chief John Seto had made contact with the Ann Arbor Public Schools to offer any assistance with safety that they may need.*

**CITY SERVICES OVER THE CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR HOLIDAY**

*Mr. Powers updated the Council and the public on the holiday hours for City service. It was noted that the municipal center offices and the 15th District Court will close at noon on both Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve and will be closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Normal trash collection will take place on Monday, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, and then resume on Wednesday through Saturday.*

*The City of Ann Arbor is providing four free drop-off locations for undecorated Christmas trees through the end of January 2013. The parking lot adjacent to the Drop-off station at 2950 E. Ellsworth near Platt Road will be available for 24/7 holiday evergreen tree drop-off. Three park locations have also been added this year, including the West Park parking lot, Gallup boat launch, and Olson Park parking lot. ## COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

*Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about a Police Video Surveillance Ordinance that was briefly discussed in the past. He stated police video surveillance is not currently being used in Ann Arbor. Councilmember Warpehoski stated there is a need to address privacy concerns versus law enforcement needs regarding this issue. He stated he and Councilmember Anglin are working on a draft ordinance that will be available for Council's consideration at a later date.*

*Councilmember Warpehoski raised some questions about the current parking ordinance enforcement on the streets. He questioned what residents can do if they regularly park on the street and happen to go on vacation, and are not able to move their vehicle every 48 hours. Chief Seto advised that residents can notify Community Standards if that is the case.*

*Mayor Hieftje reminded Councilmember Warpehoski and residents that vehicles could not be left in the streets during a snow emergency so there was some risk of leaving the vehicle while on vacation in the winter.*

### COUNCILMEMBER KAILASAPATHY

*Councilmember Kailasapathy thanked the City Administrator, Mr. Powers, for the email regarding pedestrian safety and the recent enforcement efforts. She stated the safety of school children is very important.*
