Page Ave Parking Removal

Page Avenue is scheduled to get a new sidewalk between Esch and Harpst. In order to install this sidewalk, the curb will be moved out (into the roadway) so as to minimize conflicts with utilities and provide a lawn extension. This section of Page is relatively narrow and moving the curb necessitates removal of parking on one side of the road so as to allow adequate width for vehicles. 2024 Resurfacing and Related Projects Update

The 2024 Street Resurfacing Program and Related Projects was deferred at the last meeting and will be presented by staff this month. This annual presentation will highlight which areas of the City and roadways/paths are slated for rehabilitation or preservation work in the upcoming construction cycle. Additionally, the street/utility construction dashboard has been updated to show 2024 projects.


Signalized Intersections and Non-motorized users

In the development of the Annual Work Program, the Transportation Commission requested a presentation by staff on what considerations and accommodations are made for pedestrians and bicyclists at signalized intersections. Traffic Calming/Speed Management Update

At the recommendation of the Transportation Commission, City Council passed R-23-330 "Resolution to Adopt and Improved Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program" on September 5, 2023. Since it's passage, staff has been working on strategies to
