Hi Mr. Lee,

Yes, the entire Miller corridor was change from transition to residential. The draft plan has not been adopted yet and it is still subject to change.

This change was made to keep the "transition" designation to arterials, or thoroughfares that can accommodate greater traffic flows. Miller Avenue's right-of-way is narrow (2-lanes) and was one of the few roads with these characteristics that was designated as "transition." Primarily our transition corridors are meant to align with TheRide's Priority Service or Bus Rapid Transit networks.
