Subject: Objection to ICPOC Ammendment

Hello, I'm a voting resident of ward 5 and I want to let you know that I strongly oppose the amendment to the ICPOC that would change the current language:

"Persons who are current employees of the city or who have been employed by the city, including active or former police officers, within 5 years of nomination shall not be eligible for appointment."

To say:

“Persons who are current employees of the city or who have been employed by the city, including active or former police officers, within 5 years of nomination shall not be eligible for appointment, unless this requirement is waived by a resolution approved by at least 7 members of City Council.”

This is completely antithetical to the mission and purpose of this "independent" commission, as specified and articulated by the Task Force and many many voices from the community for whom this is meant to serve. These perspectives have been extensively voiced and documented, and it would show a great lack of care for and arrogance to go against all of that expertise and perspective and hand even more power over this commission to city council and city employees.

Ms. Beaudry,

Please circulate this proposed amendment of C-3 – An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 8:

(1) *Membership.* The Commission shall consist of 11 voting members, 1 of which shall be a youth member, to be appointed by 1 or more of the City Council liaisons to the Human Rights Commission or liaisons to the Commission with the approval of the City Council. In making appointments of members to the Commission, City Council liaisons to the Human Rights Commission and the Commission shall appoint persons who, insofar as possible, represent the City's diverse population—especially those who tend to have significant negative interactions with the police and are committed to improving police and community relations. Persons who are current employees of the City or who have been employed by the City, including active or former police officers, within 5 years of nomination shall not be eligible for appointment. The requirements in the preceding sentence may be waived by a resolution approved by at least 7 members of City Council for current and former employees who are or were classified as temporary employees and who received fewer than seven pay checks in any year from the City.
