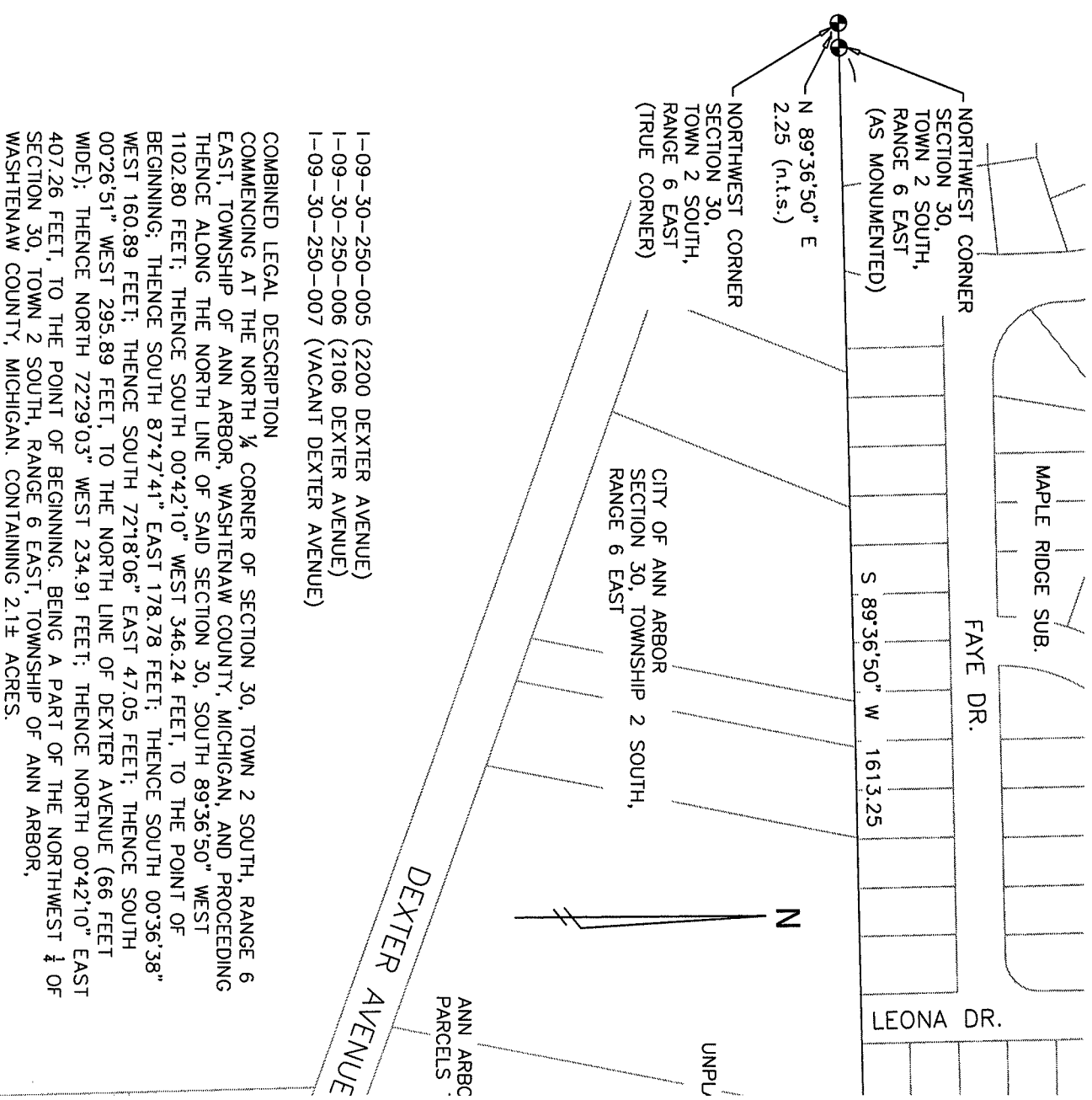

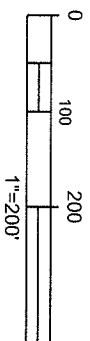

Part V

Reason for Request

The Ann Arbor Township parcel(s) proposed to be annexed into the City of Ann Arbor are surrounded by land within City of Ann Arbor jurisdiction. The primary reason the City of Ann Arbor is initiating annexation of Ann Arbor Township parcels is to reduce the duplication of municipal services. Currently, both the City and Township provide Police and Fire services within these boundaries. Annexing the properties will reduce duplication of service and increase the emergency response efficiency. Additionally, annexing the properties will allow the City to more effectively plan and implement infrastructure improvements. In 1994, the City of Ann Arbor and the Charter Township of Ann Arbor entered into an annexation agreement that indicated that after December 31, 2007, the Township would no longer contest City initiated annexations in an agreed upon service area. This annexation application is consistent with the 1994 agreement. The proposed annexations meets the conditions pursuant to Section 9 of The Home Rule City Act, 1909 PA 279. This proposed annexation includes fewer than 100 persons.
