- Target adoption: Summer 2025










DOWNTOWN AREA CIRCULATION STUDY - FOUR COMPONENTS




Built Bikeways (Separated Lanes)





- Installation of 48 additional accessible spaces underway
- Ongoing discussions with Community Standards ahead of short-term space inventory expansion

Annual Repairs & Restoration

FY25 Annual Restoration \$1,097,970

- Liberty Square- masonry and capstone work
- 4th & Washington- coatings, waterproofing, and drainage repairs
- In progress, wrapping up spring 2025

Rooftop Fencing \$1,126,555

- Replacement of rooftop fencing at six parking structures
- Anticipated completion spring 2025

Lighting and Generator Upgrades \$1,357,721

- Currently in engineering phase
- Anticipated completion summer 2025
