1. A brief description of the design concept (what the project/structure looks like).

The existing use will remain as a Petroleum-Beer/Wine/Liquor/Convenience Store. The design of the building is to reflect that of the University of Michigan with the interior & exterior in maze & blue.

The proposed building addition will be very valuable in providing the necessary space for product storage to be sold. With maintaining the current design within the downtown guidelines, the property will continue with a traditional design for a long-established petroleum and convenience store serving the University of Michigan and local residents.
