## PUBLIC COMMENT

*Marcia Polenberg-Ramsay, 524 S. First, spoke about the Council Liquor License Review Committee's previous action to recommend approval of the liquor license application of Aquamarine Springs at 507 S. Ashley. She stated she felt like the process did not follow appropriate procedures, particularly expressing concern regarding the close proximity to Dougherty School (less than 450 feet). She stated she has filed her objections with the MLCC. Ms. Ramsay stated the proposed site is in a flood plain, there is lack of available parking for a bar/restaurant, and the noise would negatively affect the neighborhood.*

*The committee members discussed Ms. Ramsay's comments and noted that many of the issue raised would be appropriately addressed in the site planning process, noting that they were outside the scope of the liquor license review process. City Clerk Jacqueline Beaudry stated she would follow-up with City staff in Planning and Development, as well as the historic district coordinator, regarding the concerns. (Ms. Ramsay provided her email information to the clerk.)*
