Hi Jack--

Sorry this took so long. I probably over thought it. I'm assuming this is a statement that isn't necessarily going to be printed by the Ann Arbor Observer... please let me know if that's wrong! Here is a very basic statement:

In my role as a Commissioner for the Human Rights Commission, I am always trying to represent the community to my fullest ability and to make sure that the public gets the information that they need. I understand that I have a forthright manner, but my goal has always been to do my job as a Commissioner. In the past, I have persistently asked for information from city staff, attempting to address problems that the community cares about, and I have pursued these requests when I have not gotten responses. I am shocked and confused by allegations that my conduct has caused anyone to cry; I have not seen this happen in front of me, certainly, and there has been no indication in any of my interactions with city staff that this has been the case. Most, if not all, of my interaction with city staff has either been at our publicly recorded meetings, or in sub-committees with other members of the Human Rights Commission present. I have never been informed that any of these interactions are why I am not being considered for a city council vote on my reappointment, and I have never received any feedback from city staff about these interactions.

Please let me know if you have any questions or feedback! I am thinking about coming to the City Council meeting tomorrow to give public comment again, so I might see you soon.
