PRESENTATION:

Planning Manager Lenart provided the presented a series of topics for feedback and direction from the Commission.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Will Leaf, resident, noted there were some critical changes that needed

- to be made stressing the importance of eliminating the three districts that restrict housing focusing on the Employment District.
- Gabe Grossman, Old 4th Ward, noted transit corridor are way too narrow and the height limits should be increased. Historic district should permit more uses.
- Jonathan Levine 456 Hilldale, we have to eliminate single-family zoning, but they don't deliver housing. Mr. Levine suggested to increase density on major corridors of South State, North Main, and West Stadium.
- Kirk Westphal, 3505 Charter Place, Where do I want to restrict housing? Public meetings showed we need more housing (5 ft increase in housing heights is not enough). Transition zone downzones some areas that are TC-1 this will also split residential zones in some areas
- Jim Pike, 912 Pomona Road, spoke in support of ending exclusionary single family zoning.
- Max, 722 E Kingsley, is surprised Old 4th Ward won't see change as the Old Fourth Ward is becoming decrepit and would like to see this area revitalized.
- Matthew Ostrosky, 2944 Birch Hollow Drive, stated zoning districts make it harder for people to get places if uses are segregated.
- Ina, Old 4th Ward resident, spoke to not restrict housing in zones noting people are desperate for housing and rent keeps going up.
- Matt Kersh, resident, would like to echo what people are saying about needing housing.
- Elise McCoy, 514 Lawrence Ave, excited for mixed use come to Ann Arbor. Spoke to South Industrial area noting she was able to walk to a handful of businesses while living there.
- Brian Chambers 2815 Timber Way, there is a new stakeholder or escalating event to back pedal away from housing as median housing price keeps going up.
- Kate, North State Street, spoke to the employment district on South Industrial noting not adding housing here is keeping this city too expensive. Industrial is a good place for mixed-use
- Kalil, Ypsilanti Township, had to move yearly because rents keep going up, and is opposed to the employment zone
- Mark Scerbo, it's hard to image an apartment building in a single-family neighborhood. How can we write a plan that is flexible to fit over the next several decades?
- Adam Jaskiewicz, 1430 Las Vegas Drive, overall there is a lot he likes about the plan. Supports low rise residential with missing middle.

 Transition is more restrictive than TC-1. No need for mixed hubs, we are not in a jobs crisis.
- Adam Goodman, 400 Virginia Avenue, biggest concern is districts that

restrict housing, as that drives up the price of housing.
