- f. Ann Arbor Affordable Housing Millage \_\_\_\_\_(Jennifer Hall, AAHC)
  - Jennifer will share updates on the recent RFP issued to award available millage dollars for rental development.
  - Your packet includes the RFP document, along with resulting City Council resolutions awarding millage funds to 3 proposals received through the RFP (Grants to Avalon Housing/Hickory Way III development and to The Annex Group/Union at A2 development; Loan to Lockwood/3695 State St)
- g. Ann Arbor Affordable Housing Fund\_\_\_\_\_\_(Tara Cohen, OCED)
  - From June 2023 to June 2024 Total of \$18.4 million approved by City Council for incoming payments in-lieu of affordable units on 3 projects (732 Packard, 711 Church, 721 S Forest)
  - RFP and Application materials pending operationalizing of the recently approved policy revisions.
- h. Washtenaw County Opportunity Index

- i. County Winter Warming Centers
  - **Program Duration**: Warming centers operate from November 11, 2024, to April 13, 2025, contingent on weather needs.
  - Daytime Warming Centers: County office lobbies during business hours and designated sites in Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti will provide weekday shelter, rotating locations as scheduled to maximize coverage.
  - Overnight Shelter: Delonis Center offers overnight warming every night starting at 7 pm. Referrals are needed from Housing Access of Washtenaw County (HAWC) during the day, with on-site assistance available after 5 pm.
  - Extreme Weather Provisions: Weather havens will activate at select locations if temperatures, including wind chill, drop to 20°F or below, for short-term relief from the cold during agencies' regular business hours. See Weather Haven handout in your packet.
  - Regular Updates and Accessibility: Locations and hours may change; updates will be posted online on OCED website <a href="here">here</a>. Key contacts for coordination include HAWC at (734) 961-1999 and the Delonis Center at (734) 662-2829.
