City Council members:

[Crashes in Ann Arbor](#) has collected AAPD police reports for 2 fatalities and 11 serious injuries sustained by pedestrians in traffic crashes so far in 2025. There are still three months left in 2025, and already more pedestrians in Ann Arbor have been seriously injured or killed by traffic crashes than in any full year since 2014.

Our city is falling far short of its [Vision Zero aspirations](#) to eliminate traffic fatalities on its streets.

As an all-season bike commuter, I am comfortable with a level of risk on city roads that most people won't tolerate. Too many people feel, very understandably, like walking and bike riding in Ann Arbor is too inconvenient and dangerous.

Please move with much greater urgency to make our city's streets safer. [Fund road diets and protected bike lanes for Stadium Blvd. and Maple Rd.](#) Direct City Staff to prioritize pedestrian safety over driver convenience in its funded studies.

Thank you for reading my message and for your service to move Ann Arbor forward.
