Dear Council Member - Ward 2 Griswold,

I urge you to support an ordinance to ban fur sales in Ann Arbor.

Ann Arbor has an opportunity to lead the way in bolstering the demand for sustainable and innovative alternatives to fur as well as increase awareness of animal welfare and foster a more humane community.

Of course, fur has grown out of favor by many, including large fashion retailers and designers. Yet, the cruel industry still thrives, causing the torture and death of 100 million animals each year. Unbeknownst to many, Michigan still has fur farms and fur trappers who inhumanely kill animals and even contribute to disease spread to humans solely to make frivolous fur-trimmed items.

Fortunately, most Ann Arbor retailers do not sell fur products. It's my understanding that any ordinance would allow those that do would have time to sell off existing inventory and transition to alternatives that have the same look and feel as fur but without the animal cruelty. And the ordinance would not apply to selling used/vintage fur, leather or shearing from animals raised for food production or fur used for religious purposes.

California became the first state to ban fur sales in 2019 after several of its cities-including Los Angeles, San Francisco, West Hollywood and Berkeley-led the way. Wellesley and Weston, Massachusetts are the latest towns to end fur sales, and Massachusetts is also considering a ban at the state level. This year, Israel became the first country to ban fur sales, and the United Kingdom is now considering a ban.

Please consider supporting a ban on fur sales in Ann Arbor.
