My name is Marieta McGraw and I am a prospective buyer and owner of the 1780 Scio Church Rd, two bedroom Townie Home here in Ann Arbor.

I am writing this email to ask for your support for expediting the necessary approvals, so that our new home could be built, and that my daughter and I could move in within the next 9-12 months.

I feel very fortunate and very excited to have been selected through the lottery process to be a homebuyer, after I applied for it last month. This opportunity to own a home in our city is incredibly important to me and to my family.

I have been living in Ann Arbor for the past 20 years. I have been working as a teacher at Ann Arbor Public Schools since 2010. I am a single parent and my child goes to Ann Arbor Public Schools. I am invested in our community and yet, I have been renting for many years now, unable to afford a home.

I want to buy a home here, but the increase in prices in the housing market, the increase in the property taxes, and the lower teaching salaries, have made it difficult for me to do so.
