AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

CAN's After School Programs are operated at 6 of our community centers and all include homework help, reading time, social-emotional development, enrichment activities, nutritious meals and snacks, connections to schools and parents, Art & Design, and more!



CAN AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM PURPOSE STATEMENTS:



- ASSIST students with developing their critical thinking skills
- GIVE the time and attention for students to report how safe and supported they feel
- **ENCOURAGE** homework completion *and* comprehension
- **HELP** students learn to enjoy reading
- PROVIDE an environment that supports the building of meaningful relationships
- CONNECT community to school
- **SUPPORT** the development of self-advocacy and tools for self-agency





CAN ART & DESIGN

Art & Design lessons are facilitated at each of our 6 community centers at least once a week during After School Program and once a day during CAN's Educational Summer Camps!

We believe that out-of-school art & design can serve as a catalyst for engaging young designers, thinkers, and leaders to create real work that makes a big difference in our communities.

Art & design provide a unique platform to learn from, engage with, and contribute to our world. They build the confidence to question, the skills to act, and the passion to create meaningful impact. Each of our projects empowers students to learn creatively and collaboratively to make work that matters.





EDUCATIONAL SUMMER CAMPS

Campers spend the mornings participating in a variety of academic activities relating to math, science, geography, language arts, nutrition and more! The afternoons are filled with thoughtfully curated lessons that align with the theme for the summer. In 2022, CAN's summer camp theme was Our Friend, Earth. Campers learned all about weather, climate change, the environment, solar power and more! In between all the exploration, campers engage in mindfulness activities, free play, exercise, and games, and enjoy 3 healthy meals!





YOUTHWORKS

CAN's YouthWorks program is a youth-driven work-readiness program for teens age 14-17 in CAN communities. YouthWorks offers interactive experiences to help teens develop employability skills needed for the workplace such as professionalism, accountability, and customer service while exploring various career fields. Teens who participate are equipped with the knowledge and experience they will need to be successful in real-world work environments!

FOOD ASSISTANCE

CAN provides consistent, diverse, and nutritious food during all of our educational programs as well as weekly food distributions and on-site emergency food pantries for families within CAN communities.

Our Bryant Community Center and Brick Community Center's food distributions and pantries are also open to all of Washtenaw County. Families who visit receive fresh groceries like meat, produce, bread, dairy, and more!

- And CAN's Bryant community is tackling the root causes of housing stabilization in partnership with the City of Ann Arbor by working towards making it the first carbon-neutral neighborhood in the midwest!
